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

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#### EXERCISE:

GENERAL SITUATION - War was declared between Red and Blue on May 1, 1940. The boundary line between the two countries is in the general line: Monterey-Fresno - Independence (California), Red lying to the north of this boundary and Blue to the south. After preliminary invasion of the Blue territory by mechanized Red forces, the enemy was driven north by the fully mobilized Blue Army. Both forces are now holding well intrenched lines defended by elaborate field fortification and action is largely stalemated and is likely to be during the coming wet season.

SPECIAL SITUATION - A major emergency having arisen, the commanding officer of the 47th General Hospital has been ordered to mobilize this unit and be ready to receive patients within 30 days from this date, December 13, 1939. All commissioned officers of the unit have reported for duty. The relief nurse and ten Red Cross nurses have arrived and additional nurses will arrive during the next two weeks. 400 enlisted men from various walks in life have arrived and been given quarters. These men are roughly tabulated as follows as to experience:

#### REQUIREMENT -

You have been assigned to the following tasks:

- 1. Training of nurses in the procedure and routine of an Army Hospital.
- 2. Selection of enlisted men for training in general nursing and ward work.
- 3. Effect plans for this training.

#### PROBLEM -

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- 1. On what basis would you procede in your selection of suitable men for ward work?
- 2. Outline a four weeks training course.
- 3. From personnel at hand how would you procede in selection of teachers?

#### SOLUTION OF SPECIAL PROBLEM NO. 2

#### SERIES OF 1939 - 40

A total of 400 men will be assigned to the 47th General Hospital, 290 of which are to be assigned to the professional services. The first step to be taken will be a survey of the personnel. This will be carried out by means of a questionnaire and a personal interview with each man by a medical officer. The results of this survey will be indicated on a large chart, exhibiting in parallel columns the names of the men, their education, their previous employment, their past experience in the Army, in hospitals, in commercial and professional pursuits, etc., and the personal impression of the examiner. The officer in charge of training will request the commanding officer to place the nurses assigned to the unit under the supervision of the ward officers. From this survey, those men with previous experience in nursing will be selected as instructors for untrained, enlisted men under the supervision of medical officers. These instructors will also receive special instruction to prepare them for assignment as ward masters and assistant ward masters.

The Plans and Training Officer will requisition sufficient supplies to be used in instruction of ward attendants and nurses. All male nurses and other men qualified for ward attendant assignments will be assigned to duty in the wards of the hospital for a period of four weeks. During this time they will act as assistants to the ward masters. In addition to their work at the hospital they will receive one hour's instruction daily.

#### OUTLINE OF INSTRUCTION

20 hours of lecture, 40 hours of demonstrations, and supervised ward work as assistant to ward masters.

#### First Week

Admission of patient. Care of patient's personal property, money and clothing. Sweeping and cleaning ward without raising dust. Temperature, pulse, respiration. Baths.

#### Second Week

Review,--especially in temperature, pulse and respiration. Bed making,--simple, surgical, fracture. Changing linen on occupied bed. Enemata. Continuous drips soaks.

Third Week Lifting and handling patients. Fowler's position. Murphy drip. Use of catheter. Hypodermic. Signs of collapse, impending death, death. Fourth Week Care of property, --property check, drawing property, exchange of property. Linen - Care, exchange, credit slips. Ward morning reports. Report of death chart.

Ward masters will be given a special course in instruction lasting four weeks. Surgical and dispensary assistants may be included. Ward officers will be responsible for instruction.
