Forestry volunteer service has many rewards by Linda Roddick dental assistant, Loma Linda Endodontics

This is the 20th anniversary of the Volunteer Act in the United States Forestry Service. The San Gorgonio Volunteer Association, of which I am president, was one of three groups selected in the U.S. to receive the Sponsored Volunteer Service Award from the Chief's Volunteer Program.

We were presented with the award for having an outstanding interpretive association. This area has branched to all parts of forest management, such as wilderness patrol, trail maintenance, Barton Flats Visitors Center operation, interpretive programs, fire prevention patrol, and visitor information.

The nomination criteria included need for the service, extent or magnitude of work, challenges met by group, effectivity of methods, innovation of group, public understanding, and enhancement of relationships between communities and USFS as to use of public lands.

In 1991 the SGVA, approximately 80 volunteers, made 22,000 visitor contacts and contributed 7.5 person years. The wilderness received around 190,000 recreation visitor days per year, some of the heaviest in the nation.

The SGVA passes on to the visitor a respect for the National Forest and its resources. As Edward Abbey once said, "Wilderness is a necessary part of civilization."

#### Physical therapy clinic helps TMJ, myofacial disorder patients

Unknown to many, the School of Dentistry has a physical therapy clinic devoted primarily to the treatment of TMJ and myofacial disorders. Started in 1990, the clinic is directed by Steve Zecker, PT. Patients are seen by Marilyn Showler, PT, who specializes in the neck and jaw area, and primarily sees patients referred by dentists.

Patients are taught to relax and balance muscles through the use of massage, heat and cold treatment, ultrasound, electric current, exercise, and mobilization.

The clinic strives to offer the highest quality care, and patients receive as much time with the physical therapist as is needed. "It pleases me to know I can really do my best," says Mrs. Showler, who has worked in the Inland Empire for 20 years.

#### Are you covered for Boards?

SACRAMENTO—After years of study and months of preparation, you're as ready as you'll ever be for the upcoming state licensure exam. But have you considered the remote possibility that something could go wrong? Who will be insuring you for a less-than-perfect result or an injury to your patient?

If you're a student member of the California Dental Association and you're taking a state board exam administered in California, you're covered by the CDA's own professional liability insurance company, The Dentists Insurance Company (TDIC). The cost of coverage is included in your CDA membership fee. CDA provides this special policy directly to UCSF, including a certificate of insurance from TDIC that was submitted with your application to the State Board of Dental Examiners.

So how are you protected? TDIC covers you for any claim involving an incident that occurs on the specific dates of your exam. For example, if a patient requires endodontic treatment as a result of an amalgam filling you place during the exam and later makes a claim against you, TDIC would defend you and cover the cost of the claim. This coverage provides up to \$100,000 per claim, for an aggregate of \$300,000 for all claims. There is no time limit for reporting claims.

This coverage includes all the other features of TDIC's professional liability policy, such as no-fault reimbursement for medical or dental expenses you incur as a result of the incident (for example, the cost of a medical x-ray if your patient swallows an object) and reimbursement for your expenses if TDIC requests your presence in court as part of your defense. Like any TDIC policyholder, you would receive the full benefit of TDIC's claim management and legal defense services, which feature some of California's leading attorneys in the area of dental professional liability.

TDIC was founded in 1979 as a wholly owned subsidiary of the California Dental Association. It was the nation's first dentist-owned professional liability insurance company. #### **Continuing Dental Education**

• Ten dentists from Taiwan attended the two-week basic implant study group from March 16 to April 1. Their studies were conducted by faculty and residents of the departments of oral implantology and the international dentist program. Simultaneous translation into the Chinese language was performed by Dr. Ming-Way Lee of IDP. Besides attending lectures by Drs. James, Lozada, Boyne, Boskovic, Soh, Emanuelli, Whittaker, GaRey, Pence, and Roberts, they also observed live surgeries and worked with several different implant systems.

• A one-week advanced implant study group attended Loma Linda from Spain, March 30 to April 3. They received lectures on ridge expansion and augmentation techniques, sinus elevation and grafting, reconstruction of maxillofacial injury, mandibular nerve repositioning, and autogenous bone grafting techniques with dental implants. They also performed mandibular nerve repositioning on cadaver heads in the anatomy lab. Lecturers for the morning course were Drs. James, Lozada, Boyne, Welch, and Emanuelli. In the afternoon they observed surgeries which were

videotaped and made available to the participants.

#### Endodontics

• Steven G. Morrow, DDS, associate professor of endodontics, School of Dentistry, gave a presentation at the spring scientific session of the California Dental Association in Anaheim, titled "Pitfalls in Endodontics, Restoration of Endodontically Treated Teeth," on Thursday, April 23.

• The Wuchenich Foundation has granted the department of endodontics a gift of \$10,000 to purchase a surgical microscope for use in the graduate endodontic clinic. The microscope will be of particular usefulness in performing endodontic surgery, which is often difficult because of the minute details involved. Another feature of the surgical microscope is that it facilitates taking both photographs and videos during clinical procedures.

• Visiting the School of Dentistry and the department of endodontics is Dr. Sung-Sam Lim from Seoul National University in South Korea. Dr. Lim arrived April 13 and will be with us until May 22. He will participate in research with Dr. Torabinejad and in graduate endodontic seminars, and will also observe in the clinics. We are pleased to have Dr. Lim visit us for a few weeks.
