Symposium and luncheon honors Dr. Buell

A symposium honoring Dr. Ronald E. Buell, "accomplished clinician, distinguished and beloved teacher of endodontics at Loma Linda University School of Dentistry," was held Sunday, October 4, at the Four Seasons hotel in Newport Beach.

Dr. Buell was a pioneer in endodontics in California. He was Orange County's first endodontist, and the first chair of endodontics at LLU.

The symposium began with a continental breakfast and registration at 8 a.m., and followed by continuing education from 8:30 a.m. to noon. Presentations were made by Philip Boyne, DMD, director of advanced education in oral and maxillofacial surgery; Peter Nordland, DMD, assistant professor of periodontics; Carl Rieder, DDS, practitioner from Newport Beach, and director of the Newport Harbor Academy of Dentistry; and Mahmoud Torabinejad, DMD, director of graduate endodontics.

A luncheon held at 12:30 p.m. was emceed by Leif K. Bakland, DDS, chair of endodontics. The program included presentations and tributes to Dr. Buell. Those participating were Judson Klooster, DDS, dean; Steven Morrow, DDS, associate professor of endodontics; Merrill Schmidt, DDS, Dr. Buell's endodontics office partner; Raleigh

Cummings, DDS, associate professor; Lloyd Baum, DMD, director of the division of international dentistry; Donald Peters, DDS, former professor of endodontics; and Maurice Cutler, DDS, alumnus.

Dr. Buell was presented with one of Dr. Peters' specially carved, lifelike ducks.

The event was also a fundraising opportunity for the department of endodontics. Donations will be used for research, clinical equipment, and incorporation of a clinical computer system.

The symposium and luncheon were coordinated by endodontic faculty Dr. Cummings, Dr. Bakland, Dr. Morrow, and Dr. Torabinejad; and by Barbara Bostwick, director of development for the School of Dentistry.

Administration

• While visiting the campuses of Andrews University and Southwestern Adventist College, Sylvia Davis, director of admissions, participated in receptions at the offices of Frank Conklin, SD'77, in Michigan, and Brady Rusk, SD'80, in Texas. The receptions were for pre-dental students to experience an

actual dental practice with an alumnus; to speak with the dental assistants, dental hygienists, and office managers; and to work with drills and amalgam in teeth mounted in plaster. The students were then treated by the School to dinner with the dentist at a local restaurant, where they continued their discussions about day-to-day professional dental practice.

- Todd Murdoch, associate dean for financial administration, and Ron Secor, dental clinics administrator, attended the American Association of Dental Schools section meetings, October 21 through 23, in Naples, Florida. About 39 schools were represented at the meeting for clinic administrators and financial administrators. Participants from the schools were able to meet and compare notes, efforts, and experiences. Much discussion centered around computerization. Loma Linda has had this since 1985, and many other schools are just now implementing clinical computerization.
- The LLU School of Dentistry booth at NASDAD and the ADA Convention in Orlando, October 15 through 20, received considerable attention from the attendees. James Crawford, DDS, associate dean for educational services, and Jerome Jablonski, DDS, director of extramural programs, reported particular interest in the extramural and international dentistry programs.

Continuing education

• The division of continuing dental education has just started its 1992-1993 study clubs again. This year there is a bonding study club, basic implant study group, and an advanced implant study group. All three were well attended at their first session, and a successful year is expected once again.

Drs. James Dunn and Joel Murray will be the clinical coordinators and instructors for the bonding study club.

The speakers for the basic implant study group include the implantology residents: Drs. Joseph Kan, Ricardo Alvarez, Hale Soh, Edward Kim, Jeff Kimura, and Paul Sorenson. The last three sessions of this study group will include live surgeries for the participants to watch, with some bringing in their own patients and doing the surgeries themselves.

The advanced implant study groups speakers include Drs. Robert James, Toni Daher, Edward McGlumphy, Jaime Lozada, Joel Rosenlicht, Michael Klein, Milos Boskovic, and Philip Boyne. Each of these sessions will include a minimum of two live surgeries, with the participants bringing and working on their own patients.
