*Two appointed to academic positions*

The faculty search committee has unanimously recommended Ronald Dailey, current associate dean for student services, to the position of associate dean for academic administration. This appointment will become effective on or about October 1, 1993, giving Mr. Dailey the time he

needs to complete his dissertation for a PhD in academic administration.

In cooperation with this role will be the position of associate dean for advanced education. Leif K. Bakland, DDS, current chair of endodontics, was unanimously nominated for this appointment by the search committee. This new position will assume administrative responsibilities for the advanced education programs, including all formal programs of post-doctoral education and residency training, as well as the office of continuing dental education. Dr. Bakland will assume this position on a half-time basis, and continue his role as chair of endodontics.

The two new associate deans will "work cooperatively to administer their specific responsibilities for all aspects of the academic programs of the School of Dentistry, keeping in focus the primary mission of a strong predoctoral program supported by the research and skills of the advanced education program," notes Dean Judson Klooster. He continues, "It is a pleasure to welcome these two valued colleagues into their new administrative responsibilities."

## *Interdepartmental*

### ***Graduating sisters tackle re-entry plan***

*The following is reprinted with permission from the May 19 issue of the San Bernardino Sun, and was written by Gregg Patton.*

You might think that people who have been away from school for an extended period of time would have forgotten the painful parts.

Not so. The dread of beastly exams, for one, we'll take with us all the way to Leisure World and beyond.

That may help explain why sisters Chris VanDenburgh [wife of David VanDenburgh, Campus Hill Church pastor] and Edie Logan [wife of Irving Logan, DDS, professor of restorative dentistry], and siblings Debbie Friesen [DH'93 and former employee of Dr. Logan] and Denise Edwards [DH'93], decided to team up as re-entry students at nursing and dental hygiene schools, respectively. Together they would stomp the beast into submission.

Three years down the road, score one—make that two—for the buddy system.

VanDenburgh, 42, and Logan, 49, are graduating together this month from the nursing program at San Bernardino Valley College and already have jobs lined up at Loma Linda University Medical Center.

And Friesen, 35, and Edwards, 37, have been side by side all the way through LLUMC's hygiene school [LLU School of Dentistry]. They

graduate in two weeks.

"There were times I got so discouraged, if I hadn't had Edie there, I don't know if I would have made it," said VanDenburgh.

Said Friesen, "There weren't any others in our class with young families. It helped having someone who understands what you're going through."

Both pairs of sisters live near each other—all in the Redlands-Loma Linda area—but neither pair studied much together.

"We yakked too much," Edwards said.

The support tended to be more for morale. VanDenburgh and Logan sat together in a car crying before their first nursing exam. Now, it's just a funny story. Then, the anxiety was real.

"If you're in a class and you don't understand something, you think, 'I don't get this, I better quit'," said Logan. "But if you find out your intelligent sister doesn't understand it either, you think, 'I'll be OK'."

All four women are mothers. Edwards is a widow who lost her husband just as her sister was about to enter hygiene school. Edwards decided to join her.

"I was in emotional upheaval," Edwards said. "It would have been much harder for me without her. Debbie helped a lot."

No sibling rivalries here.

VanDenburgh and Logan said 9

neither liked the idea of not scoring as well on a test as her sister.

"But you feel almost as bad if you do better," VanDenburgh said. "You couldn't enjoy it if your sister hadn't done well, too."

Edwards' and Freisen's families had lived next door to each other for 10 years, the households almost interchangeable. You couldn't tell an Edwards from a Freisen at the breakfast table.

"We knew we'd get along," said Friesen.

In retrospect, all four said school was time-consuming and sacrifices were made, but all are ready to get on with their new careers. As big as the task of going back to school once looked, all said the time went by quickly.

In fact, it seems like only yesterday that VanDenburgh and Logan gathered their books together for their first day of school—and a photograph.

"Can you imagine?," said VanDenburgh, laughing. "Our mother in her 70s comes over to take our picture like we're little kids."

Just imagine that—treating two mature women who have raised families, held jobs and been responsible adults for years like little kids. Like little kids, going off to school together hand in hand.

Honestly, Mom, where'd you ever get that idea?

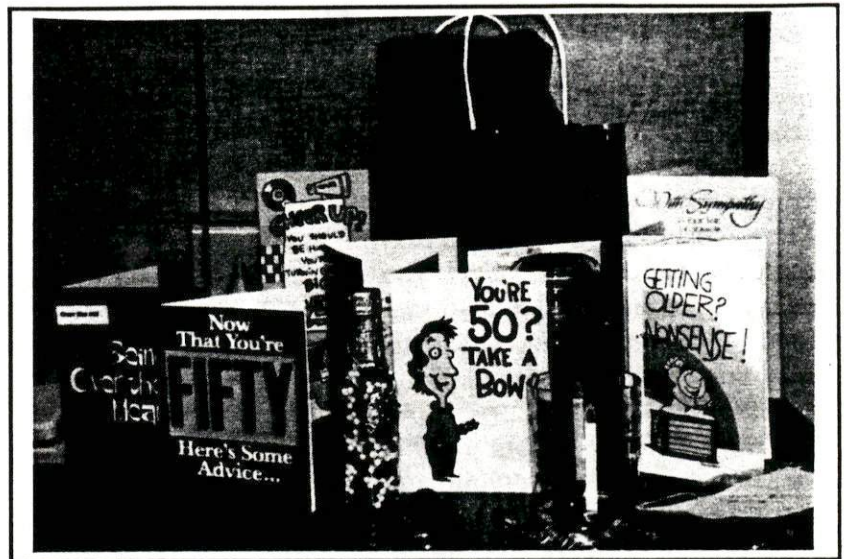
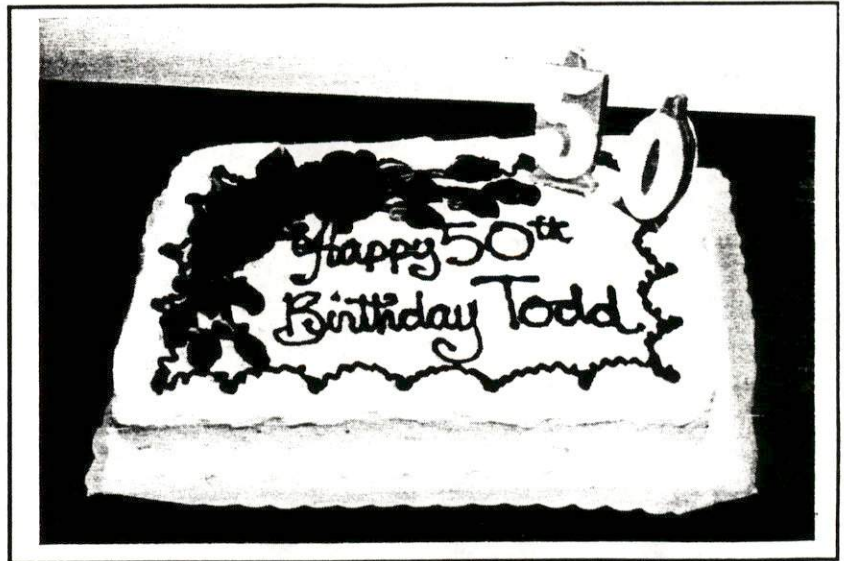
