WILFRED J. AIREY

Professor of History
College of Arts and Sciences, Loma Linda University

Dr. Airey graduated from Walla Walla College (B.A. 1933) and from the University of Washington (M.A. 1938, Ph.D. 1945). An educator for the past forty-three years, Professor Airey has been head of the La Sierra College Departments of English (1941-47) and History (1947-67). As teacher of many required (and large) history classes, he may have taught more students at Loma Linda University than any other teacher. He shows a personal concern for each student and has distinguished himself as a defender of student interests. A stimulating, challenging educator of wide expertise on both the college and academy levels, he has taught not only English and history but also political science and geography. Before coming to Loma Linda University in 1941, he served as principal of Milton Junior Academy, teaching fellow in history at the University of Washington, and instructor at Walla Walla College. A raconteur and dramatist as well as a careful scholar, he interprets the present in terms of the lessons of the past. He has served as member and director of junior college, school, and governing board associations on local and national levels. He has also been a longtime member — and president (1972-74) — of the Riverside City College Board of Trustees; active leader in civic affairs; leader in the planning and development of the La Sierra campus science complex and library; pioneer in the organization of the Faculty Senate; and contributor to the *Seventh-day Adventist Encyclopedia*. An independent thinker and a man courageous in expressing and following his conscientious convictions, Dr. Airey exerts an appealing and gracious Christian influence befitting a recipient of the Distinguished University Service Award.

H. M. S. RICHARDS, JR.

Director/Speaker, The Voice of Prophecy

H. M. S. Richards, Jr., is director/speaker of the Voice of Prophecy radiobroadcast founded by his father, Dr. H. M. S. Richards, Sr. In addition to speaking on the daily and Sunday programs, now heard on 800 North American and 1100 overseas stations, Pastor Richards supervises the development of new projects, including public service programming. He is active in the Voice of Prophecy Evangelistic Association, conducting at least one three-week Bible crusade each year; and he supervises the Voice of Prophecy's large Bible correspondence school, which has graduated more than 630,000 adults since 1942. Pastor Richards received a B.A. in ministerial studies from Loma Linda University (1952). After graduation he pastored in Dallas, Fort Worth, San Antonio, and Wichita Falls, Texas. In 1956 he was ordained to the gospel ministry. He pastored in Albuquerque, New Mexico, until joining the Voice of Prophecy staff in 1960 as assistant director. In 1969 he became director. The father-and-son broadcast team, alternating in the roles of speaker and announcer, produces the Voice of Prophecy programs. Though much sought after as a speaker for crusades, convocations, and youth congresses, Pastor Richards reserves time for his wife, Mary Margaret Gullet-Richards, and three children. The University is proud to honor him with the title University Alumnus.

WILLARD RAYMOND CENTERWALL

Professor of Pediatrics
School of Medicine, Loma Linda University

Dr. Centerwall graduated from Yale University (B.S. 1949, M.D. 1952) and took postdoctoral work at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor (M.P.H. 1967, M.S. 1968). He served for five years on the faculty of Christian Medical College in Vellore, India (1961-66), and has taught at Loma Linda University for nearly fifteen years (1955-60, 68-77) in his fields of specialty: pediatrics, maternal and child health, human and public health genetics, and cultural biomedical anthropology. An outstanding teacher, his always-new, illustrated lectures are given with authority, enthusiasm, and trenchant wit. His unique ability to reach all levels — from grade school through postdoctoral — yields many invitations to speak to civic, high school, professional, and church groups. An excellent clinician; an encourager of excellence in others; an unstinting giver of his time and knowledge; a brilliant, tireless researcher and renowned authority in genetics and allied fields; author of over 100 publications; careful planner, time manager, and program director; concerned counselor and friend of children and their families; father of six; confidante of students and colleagues — Dr. Centerwall is esteemed and honored for his integrity and selflessness as an eminent member of his profession and as a Christian gentleman. With pleasure the University presents to him the Distinguished University Service Award.

MRS. KEMPER CAMPBELL

Former Professor of Medical Jurisprudence
School of Medicine, Loma Linda University

Mrs. Campbell attended Andrews University and graduated from the Normal Department of the University of California at Los Angeles (1908) and from the School of Law at the University of Southern California (LL.B. 1913), where she was valedictorian. In 1916 she married Kemper Campbell, a Los Angeles attorney. Also in 1916 she became the first woman to be appointed Deputy District Attorney in California and was in charge of the juvenile department until 1918. Until the age of eighty-six she was actively involved in defending the legal rights of youth. She was also instrumental in securing the right of women to sit on juries and in advancing other reforms. She taught in the law school of the University of Southern California for three years and at Loma Linda University for thirty years (1913-43). She also maintained a private law practice with her husband (1913-15, 25-50), only taking time out to rear three children, one of whom is San Bernardino Superior Court Judge Joseph B. Campbell. In addition, she has pursued a literary career, authoring *Here I Raise My Ebenezer* (her autobiography) and three other books as well as short stories for national periodicals. Mrs. Campbell has received "highest commendation" in the California Congressional Record for her responsible citizenship, her concern for youth, her outstanding record of professional achievement in the practice of law, and her exemplary contribution to the education of the legal and medical professions.

FRANK W. HALE, JR.

Associate Dean, The Graduate School
Professor of Communication
Ohio State University

Dr. Hale earned the B.A. and the M.A. degrees in speech, political science, and English (1950, 1951, University of Nebraska); a Ph.D. in speech and political science (1955, Ohio State University); and a postgraduate study certificate in English literature (University of London). He has taught at Oakwood College, Ohio State University, Andrews University, and Central State University (Ohio). He has also served as director of public relations, head of the Department of Speech, assistant to the president, and president at Oakwood College; chairman of the Department of English at Central State University; and associate dean of the Graduate School at Ohio State University. Dr. Hale is listed in various international biographies, success libraries, and *Who's Who* publications as an outstanding American, educator, communicator, and administrator. He has been honored by universities, colleges, alumni associations, communities, and civic organizations with numerous awards, citations, and recognitions; and he received the Ohio Governor's Award for Community Action. Dr. Hale holds membership in eleven professional organizations in the field of education and serves on twenty boards of directors (educational, civic, medical, literary). He has been book consultant for the American Library Association journal, *Choice*; communications consultant for four colleges and universities; and consultant for the Ohio State Department of Administrative Services. A popular speaker at universities, conferences, and workshops, he also lectures before twenty-five to thirty church, civic, and professional organizations each year. World traveler and author of twenty-three articles and books on black history, current minority affairs, speech, and education — including *Sunlight and Shadows* and *The Cry for Freedom* — his diversity and depth honor his church and community and enrich the nation.

MOLLEURUS COUPERUS

Clinical Professor of Dermatology
School of Medicine, Loma Linda University

Born in Germany of Dutch parents, Dr. Couperus graduated in 1924 from the Neandertal Seminary in Germany and came to America that same year. He received his B.A. from Andrews University (1927) and his M.D. from Loma Linda University (1934). He passed the Triple Board examinations of the Royal College of Surgeons (Scotland, 1936); spent some time practicing in Jordan where he treated the future king, Prince Hussein; and, after two years of postdoctoral studies at Columbia University's Skin and Cancer Hospital, was certified by the American Board of Dermatology (1941). Joining the faculty of Loma Linda University's School of Medicine in 1944, Professor Couperus taught for thirty-three years in the Department of Dermatology and was for thirteen years (until 1977) head of the department. Appointed by the International Task Force on Educational Programs in Dermatology, Dr. Couperus was the principal investigator in the production of the *International Source Book for Educational Material in Dermatology*. He has also taught physical anthropology in the Graduate School and the College of Arts and Sciences. Through his research in anthropology, paleontology, and archeology, he is working to bring to light evidence which verifies the doctrine of Creation. Editor of the *Alumni Journal* of the University's School of Medicine (1946-50) and founding editor of *Spectrum*, he has also authored over thirty scientific and scholarly articles. Beloved by his patients and esteemed by his colleagues as a brilliant scientist, clinician, diagnostician, therapist, and author, he is more than worthy of the Distinguished University Service Award.

ACADEMIC COSTUME

THE WEARING of academic costume for commencement and other special events has practical, symbolic, and festive meanings. It provides a simple answer for what-to-wear questions. It is a means of identifying persons, groups, and fields of knowledge. It reminds onlookers and wearers alike that the art and science of *learning*, with roots extending deep into the past, have timelessness whatever the mood of the given age. . . . But most significantly, perhaps — the array of colors and forms adds elements of sprightliness and celebration to the annual event honoring graduates, and the occasion can become one for reflecting that variety and diversity, yet harmony, are intrinsically part of the wholeness of knowledge.



The prescribed academic costume of certain British and European institutions of the fifteenth and sixteenth centuries grew out of the daily garb of the twelfth century, when all persons — men, women, tradesmen, professionals, students, apprentices, poor, rich — wore full-flowing robes. A cowl-like appendage (the hooded cloak) was worn over the robe.

In the United States, a system of academic costume evolved as the outgrowth of a conference held in 1895 by representatives of interested institutions. Periodically it has been reviewed by the American Council on Education. Said to be simple, appropriate, and comprehensible by comparison with other codes, the American system is constructed so that the color and style details of gown, hood, and cap combine to tell specific things about the wearer's degree and branch of learning.

GOWN. The most common color for the gown is black, though some universities have adopted gowns with color or style distinctive of the institution. . . . The *sleeve* indicates the degree of the wearer: ASSOCIATE, BACHELOR, long, open, pointed, the tip extending below the hip; MASTER, oblong, square at the back, an arc at the front, the tip extending below the knee; DOCTOR, voluminous, bell-shaped, wrist-length. . . . *Velvet bands* identify the doctor's gown, a wide panel either side of the front opening, and across the upper portion of the sleeve three narrow bands, either black or a color indicating kind of degree or branch of learning.

HOOD. Usually the most colorful part of the costume, the hood is worn hanging loosely down the back. . . . It is *lined* with the official color or colors of the university conferring the degree, and these are exposed where the hood turns outward at the center back. The band of *velvet* on either side of the center turnback (fully exposed around the front of the neck) is the color indicating the kind of degree or the branch of learning. . . . The *style* and length of the hood indicate the level of the degree: ASSOCIATE, two feet long, straight edge; BACHELOR, three feet long, pointed, two-inch velvet band; MASTER, three and a half feet long, pointed, three-inch velvet band; DOCTOR, four feet long, paneled at the side, rounded lower corners, five-inch velvet band.

COLORS. The hoods of candidates and graduates of Loma Linda University are lined with a *field of gold* and a *purple chevron*. . . . Faculty members wearing hoods (and special gowns in some cases) of the universities from which they have earned degrees represent some of the following institutions.

THE MACE. Traditionally the ceremonial mace represents the authority vested in the highest officer of a governing body. In an educational institution, the authority symbolized by the mace derives from respect for the authority of knowledge and for the rights and value of the individual. Thus, the leader of an academic community assumes the obligation and challenge to ensure for its members a climate conducive to growth in knowledge and grace.

The construction of the ceremonial mace of Loma Linda University evokes further ideas. Its two metals, bronze and aluminum, suggest the value of lessons both ancient and contemporary. Rather than lying prone, an instrument to be wielded, this mace stands upright in celebration of the free human spirit. Its open construction implies free exposure to questions, ideas, and conflict. The eight vertical supporting elements (at three points bound together as for strength and stability in unity) uphold a graceful oval that points outward to the universe, the province of inquiry.

Within the oval, the University seal appears to float unfettered. The caduceus on the left represents all fields of the healing arts and sciences. The broken sword on the right implies mercy in the sense of selflessness and restraint from acts and attitudes of self-aggrandizement and destructiveness. The open book suggests God the Word as the basis for all truth. The lighted torch symbolizes the illuminating power of knowledge and the University's central purpose of forwarding and perpetuating good through the enlightened, searching, caring mind and conscience of the individual.
