

Service Learning - Caring for Those in Cuba

Faculty and students from Loma Linda University School of Dentistry embarked on two significant trips to Cuba, participating in a pioneering dental health fair in Havana. The first trip, a four-day clinic, was held at Seminario Teologico Adventista de Cuba (SETAC) Theological Seminary and the Public Health Clinic in the Boyeros Municipality. This initiative aimed to provide dental care to the people of Cuba while fostering a strong relationship with the Cuban public health officers. The second trip, a five-day clinic, extended the reach of the initiative by including a health fair on the last day, where students educated patients on good oral health care. The Office of Religious Affairs, in collaboration with public health officials from Cuba, coordinated both trips, underscoring the impactful partnership between the School and the Cuban public health sector.

Supplies can be challenging to get in Cuba, so the School needed to bring it's own resources with them. Each student and faculty member was given a box of supplies to pack in their luggage for the trip. Both trips successfully distributed the supplies and got them to their destination.

The team was well received, and patients were eager to see them. People lined up early and were willing to wait for an exam. Students and faculty were struck by how determined and strong the people of Cuba are. No obstacle was too significant. They would simply adapt and overcome



The students treated patients from all walks of life and were greeted with nothing but joy and gratefulness. It was a very inspiring and humbling experience.

LLUSD students and Cuban dental professionals provided a variety of services, including cleanings, fillings, extractions, and oral hygiene instruction. During the busy trips, the students treated 50-60 patients daily, which added up to around 300-500 patients per trip. The students' professionalism and hard work impressed their Cuban dental counterparts.

The students felt the trips were worthwhile for several reasons. First, and perhaps most importantly, they had the opportunity to fulfill a calling to serve and give back in a meaningful way. Secondly, they treated challenging cases and encountered situations that they may not have had the opportunity to experience in the States. Those clinical experiences helped the students learn to problem solve in a different way. Because of this, many of the students believe both trips were beneficial to their education and wish more of their peers could share a similar experience.

As the second half of 2024 quickly approaches, it is crucial to anticipate upcoming legislation that will positively influence dental offices across California. Two significant laws, AB 1048 and AB 952, have recently passed, and aim to streamline dental office billing and expedite patient care. These laws take effect January 1, 2025, and will bring about promising changes.

AB 1048 prohibits dental benefit plans from denying claims when a patient has a pre-existing condition. This is a significant benefit for patients, ensuring they will not be penalized for their health history. It will also prohibit plans from implementing unsupported wait periods before a patient's coverage starts, which should lead to faster access to care.

The second law, AB 952, directly impacts the billing process in dental offices. It mandates that dental plans must disclose whether they are state or federally regulated. This transparency empowers dental offices to bill insurance correctly, reducing the chances of claims being denied. It will also help denied patients start the correct appeals process faster.

The primary objective of both laws is to enhance patients' access to care and afford necessary dental care. Patients often struggle due to high costs and limited insurance coverage. While these laws may not resolve all dental office and patient challenges, they are a significant stride in the right direction.



\$4M National Cancer Institute Grant Awarded to Chi Viet, DDS, MD, PhD, FACS

A \$4M National Cancer Institute (NCI) R01 grant has been awarded to Chi Viet, DDS, MD, PhD, FACS, a surgeon scientist and Associate Professor of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at Loma Linda University School of Dentistry. This grant is allocated for the study of oral pre-cancer and its progression to oral cancer. The research will focus on using artificial intelligence (AI) to develop a multi-omic biomarker to identify patients with oral pre-cancer who are at the highest risk of developing cancer.

Dr. Viet joined the faculty at Loma Linda University School of Dentistry in August 2019. Since then, she and her team have created a research program that investigates treatment strategies for oral cancer. Through her hard work and dedication, Dr. Viet has brought in over \$9 million in research funding to LLU. The research is highly translational, enrolling oral cancer patients treated by her, and her colleagues, directly into clinical studies performed by the lab.

Oral cancer is a deadly disease, and in the U.S. alone, one person dies of oral cancer every hour. Dr. Viet, whose surgical practice is focused on oral cancer, explains, "There has not been any significant improvement in oral cancer treatment or survival in past decades. Patients suffer through highly disfiguring surgery and chemoradiation but are faced with terrible odds of beating their cancer."

One way to increase survival rates is by diagnosing cancer at its earliest stages. Currently, about 10% of people have oral lesions that can appear as white or red lesions. A proportion of these lesions are pre-cancerous and often lead to a cancer diagnosis. Dr. Viet's research uses a patient's molecular signature—a combination of histologic and epigenetic marks—to identify cancer progression.

This most recent research grant is performed in collaboration with, Bradley Aouizerat, PhD, Deputy Director and Professor at New York University Dentistry Translational Research Center, who is a molecular epidemiologist focused on multi-omic signatures of complex diseases, and Alexander Pearson, MD, PhD,

Associate Professor of Medicine at University of Chicago, a medical oncologist who uses mathematical modeling, high dimensional statistics, and basic tumor biology methods to investigate head and neck cancer.

The future is hopeful because of surgeon scientists like Dr. Viet, who work tirelessly to further oral cancer research. The School is proud of the work Dr. Viet and her team are doing towards earlier detection of oral cancer.

Dental Hygiene class graduates in China

Dental Hygienists, a crucial part of Western medicine, are not always recognized as such in other countries. To address this, the Loma Linda University School of Dentistry, in a groundbreaking collaboration with Sir Run Run Shaw Hospital and Hangzhou City University (previously Zhejiang University City College), has pioneered a unique program. This program combines dental hygiene and nursing classes, leading to a bachelor's degree in nursing with a Certificate in Dental Hygiene upon graduation.

To qualify for the program, students must take the GOKAO test, also known as the Nationwide Unified Examination for Admissions to General Universities and Colleges. This test is similar to an aptitude test that helps students determine their career path. Students who perform well on the test and admission interviews may be accepted into the program.

LLUSD closely collaborates with HCU to create a curriculum that prepares the students for their future careers. With generous donations, an oral simulation laboratory was created at HCU where students can practice and perfect their skills. They currently work on their peers and mannequins, but it is hoped that more patients will soon embrace a preventative approach.

Two classes have already graduated from the program with some already growing their careers in the dental hygiene field. A new program is being developed with HCU to transition students

into a dedicated program focusing on dental hygiene only without the nursing component. The students who complete this program will graduate with an Associate of Science Degree in Dental Hygiene.

The future looks bright for the students of HUC, and LLUSD is committed to supporting the program.

The School is so grateful for the opportunity to attend, network, and be part of such an amazing dental community. We hope to see you all at next year's CDA event May 15 - 17, 2025.


