Elder Bradford is a graduate of Oakwood College (B.A. 1946). In 1978 he received the Doctor of Divinity degree from Andrews University. He began his pastoral ministry in the Southwest Region Conference (1946-52) and continued in the Central States Conference (1953-57). From 1957-59 he was departmental secretary in the Northeastern Conference and returned to pastoral work in that conference from 1959-61. He subsequently served as president of Lake Region Conference (1961-70); associate secretary of the General Conference (1970-79); and vice president, North American Division (1979-present). Elder Bradford has served on numerous and diverse committees and has given unstintingly of his time and talents in service to the church and the community.



THE MACE. Traditionally the ceremonial mace represents the authority vested in the highest officer of a governing body. In an educational institution, the authority symbolized by the mace derives from respect for the authority of knowledge and for the rights and value of the individual. Thus, the leader of an academic community assumes the obligation and challenge to ensure for its members a climate conducive to growth in knowledge and grace.

The construction of the ceremonial mace of Loma Linda University evokes further ideas. Its two metals, bronze and aluminum, suggest the value of lessons both ancient and contemporary. Rather than lying prone, an instrument to be wielded, this mace stands upright in celebration of the free human spirit. Its open construction implies free exposure to questions, ideas, and conflict. The eight vertical supporting elements (at three points bound together as for strength and stability in unity) uphold a graceful oval that points outward to the universe, the province of inquiry.

Within the oval, the University seal appears to float unfettered. The caduceus on the left represents all fields of the healing arts and sciences. The broken sword on the right implies mercy in the sense of selflessness and restraint from acts and attitudes of self-aggrandizement and destructiveness. The open book suggests God the Word as the basis for all truth. The lighted torch symbolizes the illuminating power of knowledge and the University's central purpose of forwarding and perpetuating good through the enlightened, searching, caring mind and conscience of the individual.



Preceding the president's party and the candidates for degrees are the University commencement marshal and the associate marshals, carrying the University mace and batons. Loma Linda University's colors — gold and purple — are represented in the marshals' gold-colored gowns trimmed with purple velvet.
