THE MACE. Traditionally the ceremonial mace represents the authority vested in the highest officer of a governing body. In an educational institution, the authority symbolized by the mace derives from respect for the authority of knowledge and for the rights and value of the individual. Thus, the leader of an academic community assumes the obligation and challenge to ensure for its members a climate conducive to growth in knowledge and grace.

The construction of the ceremonial mace of Loma Linda University evokes further ideas. Its two metals, bronze and aluminum, suggest the values of lessons both ancient and contemporary. Rather than lying prone, an instrument to be wielded, this mace stands upright in celebration of the free human spirit. Its open construction implies free exposure to questions, ideas, and conflict. The eight vertical supporting elements (at three points bound together as for strength and stability in unity) uphold a graceful oval that points outward to the universe, the province of inquiry.

Within the oval, the University seal appears to float unfettered. The caduceus on the left represents all fields of the healing arts and sciences. The broken sword on the right implies mercy in the sense of selflessness and restraint from acts and attitudes of self-aggrandizement and destructiveness. The open book suggests God the Word as the basis for all truth. The lighted torch symbolizes the illuminating power of knowledge and the University's central purpose of forwarding and perpetuating good through the enlightened, searching, caring mind and conscience of the individual.



Preceding the president's party, the faculty, and the candidates for degrees are the University commencement marshal and/or associate marshals, carrying the University mace and batons. Loma Linda University's colors — gold and purple — are represented in the marshals' gold-colored gowns trimmed with purple velvet.

THE SPEAKERS

NORMAN COUSINS

Adjunct Professor of Medical Humanities
School of Medicine, University of California, Los Angeles
President, World Federalists Association

The record of Mr. Cousins' accomplishments is so full that it is not easily summarized. He has been the recipient of an array of high and well-merited distinctions: honorary degrees from fifty-three colleges and universities, the United Nations Peace Medal, the American Peace Award, the Family of Man Award, the Eleanor Roosevelt Peace Award, and the Gold Medal of his alma mater — Teacher's College, Columbia University — to name only a few. A stellar exemplar of dedicated public service, his influence and expertise have lent themselves to many challenges and efforts. A brief resumé of these would include his functioning as head of the New York Commission that designed the Environmental Protection Administration for that city, his heading of the commission that reorganized public education in Connecticut, and his chairmanship of a Pulitzer Prize jury in literature. As a founder of public television in the United States, he served as chairman of NET, the predecessor organization to the Corporation for Public Broadcasting. He served for thirty-five years as editor of the *Saturday Review* and is the author of seventeen books, including *The Healing Heart*, *Human Options*, *The Physician in Literature*, and *Anatomy of an Illness*. Mr. Cousins' address will be delivered at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Medicine.



JERRY WILEY

Vice Dean and Professor of Law
University of Southern California Law Center

Mr. Wiley earned the Bachelor of Arts degree from Union College (1955), the Master of Arts degree from the University of Nebraska (1959), and the Juris Doctorate degree from the University of Southern California (1967). He began his professional career as a member of the faculty and director of public relations at Union College (1957-60). Subsequently he became the director of public relations at Loma Linda University (1960-64) and owner of Jerry Wiley and Associates (1962-69). He currently serves as vice dean and professor of law at the University of Southern California Law Center where his duties are numerous and varied. His extensive community service and public relations and development endeavors are numerous, having benefitted a wide variety of professional, service, and educational institutions — including the American Medical Association, the California Medical Association, Los Angeles County Medical Association, California Heart Association, Garfield Hospital, Loma Linda University, Loma Linda University Medical Center, and the White Memorial Medical Center. He has presented and published numerous papers on the problems of health care delivery, continuing education, the first amendment, and other subjects, in publications and programs sponsored by the University of Southern California, Yale University, Northwestern University, Walla Walla College, Union College, and Tulane University. Mr. Wiley's address will be delivered at the Conferring of Degrees for the Graduate School.

JOHN P. LEHMAN

Dentist, Whittier, California
President, California Dental Association

Dr. Lehman is a graduate of the University of Southern California (B.S. 1955), Biola University (A.A. 1957), and Loma Linda University (D.D.S. 1962). At the time of his graduation from this University, he received the President's Award for the School of Dentistry and the Southern California Dental Association Award. He served as a faculty member in the School of Dentistry from 1962 until 1970, when he established a private practice. He is active in a number of community service organizations, including Cub Scouts, Boys' Club, Dads' Club, and Rotary International; and in the congregation of his local church, Trinity United Presbyterian (Santa Ana), where he is an elder. He not only holds membership in many professional organizations, but also has served these organizations in various elected capacities. Among these are president of the Harbor Dental Society, which recently honored him as Dentist of the Year; vice president for the California Dental Association (CDA); and president of the CDA, the first graduate of this School of Dentistry to fill this post. Dr. Lehman's address will be delivered at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Dentistry.



WILLIAM SHELLY

Chaplain, Loma Linda University Medical Center

Chaplain Shelly is an alumnus of Southern College (B.A. 1974) and Andrews University Theological Seminary (M.DIV. 1977). He is currently enrolled in the doctoral degree program in ministry at the School of Theology at Claremont. During his ministry Chaplain Shelly has served as associate pastor of the Chattanooga Seventh-day Adventist Church (Tennessee 1977-78); pastor of the Maryville Seventh-day Adventist Church (Tennessee 1978-81); and pastor of the Yucaipa Seventh-day Adventist Church (California 1981-85). In 1985 he joined the Department of Chaplain Services at Loma Linda University Medical Center. Chaplain Shelly's address will be delivered at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Nursing.



FRITZ GUY

Associate Pastor, University Church (Loma Linda)

Dr. Guy is an alumnus of La Sierra College (now College of Arts and Sciences of Loma Linda University, B.A. 1952); Andrews University (M.A. 1955, B.D. 1961); and the University of Chicago Divinity School (M.A. 1966, PH.D. 1971). He began his professional career in 1952 as a minister and evangelist in the Southeastern California Conference. From 1957 to 1960 he was assistant editor of the *Youth's Instructor*. In 1960 Dr. Guy returned to Loma Linda University as a faculty member in the College of Arts and Sciences. While associated with this University he filled teaching and administrative positions, including dean of the College of Arts and Sciences. In 1977 he joined the faculty of the Theological Seminary at Andrews University. There he served as professor of theology until 1984 when he returned to Loma Linda as associate pastor of the University Church. He has lectured extensively and has written numerous scholarly and popular articles both for denominational and nondenominational journals. Dr. Guy will give his address at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Allied Health Professions.

WINTON H. BEAVEN

Assistant to the President
Kettering Medical Center (Ohio)

Dr. Beaven graduated from Atlantic Union College (B.A. 1937), Clark University (M.A. 1938), and the University of Michigan (PH.D. 1950). He began his teaching career as an instructor in history at Madison College in 1938. From 1940 to 1943 he was instructor in speech and English and dean of men at Atlantic Union College. He taught at Union College in the Department of Speech (1943-45) and later served as chairman of the department (1946-50). He continued his teaching career at the University of Michigan (1950-53). From 1953 to 1957 he served in Washington, D.C., as associate secretary of the International Commission for the Prevention of Alcoholism. Returning to the field of education, Dr. Beaven served as dean of the Graduate School of Potomac University (now Andrews University 1956-59); dean of academic administration at Columbia Union College (1959-65); and president of Columbia Union College (1965-70). From 1970 to 1983 he was dean of Kettering College of Medical Arts, and from 1972 to 1983 he was vice president for education at Kettering Medical Center. His special interest, the prevention of alcoholism and drug abuse, has involved him in the directing of institutes in the United States, Holland, Switzerland, Australia, and Poland. Among the numerous publications to his credit are: "Douglas MacArthur," *Quarterly Journal of Speech*; "So You Want to Be a Public Speaker," *These Times*; speech articles in the *Central States Speech Association Journal* and the *Western States Speech Association Journal*; and general articles in *Christian Herald*, *Listen*, and various trade journals. He served as cospeaker on the television program "Concept" from 1964 to 1970 (station WMAL, channel 7, in Washington, D.C.). Dr. Beaven will deliver his address at the Conferring of Degrees for the College of Arts and Sciences and the School of Education.



HELEN W. THOMPSON

Vice President for Academic Administration
Loma Linda University

Dr. Thompson is a graduate of Walla Walla College (B.A. 1949) and Stanford University (M.A. 1955, PH.D. 1965). She began her professional career as assistant dean of women and instructor in English at Loma Linda University (then La Sierra College 1949-52). Subsequent denominational service has included faculty and administrative positions at Walla Walla College and Southwestern Union College. In 1984 she assumed the position of vice president for academic administration at this University. In spite of her full administrative schedule, she finds time to publish articles in various denominational publications, participate in professional oncampus activities, and maintain active membership in educational and professional associations. Dr. Thompson will deliver her address at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Health.

THE HONOREES

ALAN R. COLLINS

Professor of Art

College of Arts and Sciences, Loma Linda University

Mr. Collins is a graduate of the Royal College of Art in London, England (1951), and is a Fellow of the Royal Society of British Sculptors (1965). He has taught at a number of art institutions in Britain; and his sculptures done for cathedrals, churches, universities, banks, and other businesses have earned him numerous awards and honors. In 1968 Mr. Collins joined the faculty of Atlantic Union College, serving there until 1971. Subsequently he accepted academic positions at Andrews University (1971-78) and Loma Linda University (1978-present). Since coming to the United States he has continued to execute commissions for the church and private individuals. In the Inland Empire he is probably best known for his life-sized stone group, known as "The Good Samaritan," located on the Loma Linda campus of this University. Mr. Collins will receive the DISTINGUISHED UNIVERSITY SERVICE AWARD at the Conferring of Degrees for the College of Arts and Sciences and the School of Education.



FRANK W. JOBE

Executive Medical Director, Cofounder, National Athletic Health Institute

Medical Director, Centinela-NAHI Biomechanics Laboratory

Dr. Jobe earned the Bachelor of Arts degree from the College of Arts and Sciences (formerly La Sierra College) in 1949, and the Doctor of Medicine degree from the School of Medicine (formerly College of Medical Evangelists) in 1956. In addition to his medical practice at Centinela Hospital Medical Center and his teaching assignments in the Department of Orthopedics at the University of Southern California School of Medicine, Dr. Jobe also volunteers services to the National Athletic Health Institute. This nonprofit organization, which he cofounded, provides gratuitous services — including treatment of injuries, research, testing, and rehabilitation — for high school athletes. He also acts as an orthopedic consultant for major southern California sports teams — Dodgers, Lakers, Rams, Kings, Angels — and for the Professional Golfers' Association Tour. He is a recognized expert in the field of sports medicine, and his contributions to the literature are extensive. The numerous awards and honors presented to him attest to his many professional and civic activities. The title UNIVERSITY ALUMNUS will be conferred on Dr. Jobe at the Conferring of Degrees for the College of Arts and Sciences and the School of Education.

S. ALBERTA MAZAT

Professor of Marriage and Family Therapy

College of Arts and Sciences and the Graduate School, Loma Linda University

Mrs. Mazat is an alumna of Loma Linda University, where she completed the registered nurse program in 1942; and a graduate of the University of Denver (B.A. 1968, M.S.W. 1970). She has worked as a staff nurse and as a medical social worker at Loma Linda University Medical Center. From 1971 to 1977 she was assistant professor of marriage and family therapy and a lecturer in the Department of Psychology (College of Arts and Sciences). In 1977 she became chairman of the Department of Marriage and Family Therapy, serving in this capacity until 1981. Since 1982 she has served as professor in the department. Mrs. Mazat holds membership in many professional organizations and in several honor societies. In addition to publishing numerous articles, she has authored two books: *That Friday in Eden* and *Fullness of Joy*. The General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists frequently depends upon her expertise in the area of human sexuality and has featured her in a five-part videotaped series on sex education for high school students. The series is widely used and has been dubbed into Russian and shown at religious gatherings throughout the U.S.S.R. Mrs. Mazat will receive the DISTINGUISHED UNIVERSITY SERVICE AWARD at the Conferring of Degrees for the College of Arts and Sciences and the School of Education.



WINTON H. BEAVEN

Assistant to the President

Kettering Medical Center (Ohio)

Dr. Beaven graduated from Atlantic Union College (B.A. 1937), Clark University (M.A. 1938), and the University of Michigan (PH.D. 1950). He began his teaching career as an instructor in history at Madison College in 1938. From 1940 to 1943 he was instructor in speech and English and dean of men at Atlantic Union College. He taught at Union College in the Department of Speech (1943-45) and later served as chairman of the department (1946-50). He continued his teaching career at the University of Michigan (1950-53). From 1953 to 1957 he served in Washington, D.C., as associate secretary of the International Commission for the Prevention of Alcoholism. Returning to the field of education, Dr. Beaven served as dean of the Graduate School of Potomac University (now Andrews University 1956-59); dean of academic administration at Columbia Union College (1959-65); and president of Columbia Union College (1965-70). From 1970 to 1983 he was dean of Kettering College of Medical Arts, and from 1972 to 1983 he was vice president for education at Kettering Medical Center. His special interest, the prevention of alcoholism and drug abuse, has involved him in the directing of institutes in the United States, Holland, Switzerland, Australia, and Poland. IVOR C. WOODWARD

Dean, School of Allied Health Professions
Loma Linda University

Dr. Woodward is an alumnus of Pacific Union College (B.A. 1942, B.TH. 1944); Fresno State College (M.A. 1954); and the University of Southern California (PH.D. 1968). During his professional career he has taught on the high school and college levels. In the area of radiologic physics he has made significant contributions — publishing articles in scientific journals, making presentations before professional societies, and serving as consultant for the state of California in the area of medical radiation hazards. His efforts were instrumental in obtaining state licensing that permits the University to review and authorize the use of radioactive materials. His appointment as dean of the School of Allied Health Professions in 1956 marks him as the longest-tenured dean in the University's history. The DISTINGUISHED UNIVERSITY SERVICE AWARD will be presented to Dr. Woodward at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Allied Health Professions.



HULDA H. CROOKS

Research Assistant
School of Health, Loma Linda University

Mrs. Crooks earned the Bachelor of Science degree in dietetics from Loma Linda University in 1943. In 1952 she joined the Department of Pharmacology in the School of Medicine as a research assistant. She transferred to the School of Health in 1967. During her years as research assistant and later research associate, she wrote or coauthored many papers published in science journals, health periodicals, and denominational magazines. Her hobby of backpacking has made her a near legend. Her yearly ascents of Mt. Whitney, begun twenty-four years ago at age sixty-six, have been chronicled in magazines and featured on national television. Mrs. Crooks continues to do volunteer work for the School of Health as a research assistant and consultant in the health promotion and education program. The DISTINGUISHED UNIVERSITY SERVICE AWARD will be presented to Mrs. Crooks at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Health.

IRMA B. VYHMEISTER

Professor of Nutrition
Andrews University

Dr. Vyhmeister earned degrees from Loma Linda University (B.S. 1956, M.S. 1958) and the University of California, Los Angeles (DR.P.H. 1974). She taught in the School of Health from 1959 to 1981, when she became associate director of the Health and Temperance Department of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. In 1985 she joined the faculty of Andrews University in her present position as professor of nutrition. Dr. Vyhmeister has published numerous articles in professional journals and denominational magazines, including a monthly health column for *El Centinela*, a Spanish-language periodical which was published from 1960 to 1976. She is a member of a number of professional organizations, including the American Dietetic Association and the S.D.A. Dietetic Association (which honored her in 1983 with the Award for Distinguished Service). Although Dr. Vyhmeister is no longer a faculty member at this University she remains a lecturer and consultant in the School of Health Department of Nutrition. The title UNIVERSITY ALUMNUS will be conferred on her at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Health.
