Mission trips are being planned

Endodontics

• Leif K. Bakland, DDS, professor and chair of endodontics and associate dean for advanced education, attended the 135th Annual Session of the American Dental Association in New Orleans, October 22 to 26. He served as alternate delegate to the House of Delegates representing the California Dental Association. Dr. Bakland is the current president of Tri County Dental Society.

• Dr. Bakland will be leaving on November 16 for a one-month study leave to the University Hospital of Copenhagen, Denmark. The purpose of the study, which is sponsored by a grant from the World Health Organization, is to observe the dental emergency service at the Copenhagen hospital. In particular, the treatment of dental trauma has earned the Danish dental clinic, under the direction of Dr. Jens O. Andreasen, worldwide recognition. Dr. Andreasen has promoted research and treatment of dental trauma and is the author of numerous papers and several textbooks on this subject.

were implant residents: Young Choi, DDS, on Biomechanical Compressive Strength in Human Mandibular Trabecular Bone; Monica Bijlani, DDS, on 3D Finite Element Analysis of Controlled Lateral Forces on Pairs of Implants in the Maxilla and Mandible; and Oliver Hanisch, DDS, on Histomorphomet Evaluation of the Augmented Maxillary Sinus in Humans.

• The oral implantology program has been awarded \$10,700 for Osseous Regeneration of Peri-Implant Defects Using a Reinforced eptfe Membrane in Conjunction with a Demineralized Freezedried Bone Allograft.

• Philip Boyne, DMD, professor, and Dr. Lozada have begun a clinical research project with BMP (bone morphogenetic protein) for maxillary sinus augmentation. Drs. Boyne and Lozada comprise one of the four groups in the world which are investigating this product.

• Dr. Lozada has been busy with presentations during October: Grafting in Maxillary Sinus for the International Association of Dental Traumatology in La Jolla, October 12; Implant Assisted Restorations for Implant Periodontics Study Group in San Francisco, October 14; and Single Tooth Replacement with Dental Implants for the International Association of Dental Traumatology 5th World Congress in La Jolla, October 16. He also participated in the second session of the Implant Study Club held at LLU on October 20, and in the second session of the Implant Study Club held in Mexico City at the Universidad de Puebla on October 23.

• Ulf Wikesjö, DDS, PhD, director of advanced education, recently presented a course on periodontal regeneration at the University of Ferrara, Italy, for 250 general dentists and specialists. In addition, he conducted a research seminar with his collaborators Drs. Giorgia Calura, chair of clinical services, and Leonardo Trombelli, principal clinical scientists, from the University of Ferrara. • Dr. Peter Holbrook, professor of oral biology, University of Iceland, visited advanced periodontics to discuss continued research collaboration between his university and the LLU department. 



and Martin Knopper, photographic coordinator, Graphics Studio, helped the weekend run smoothly by handling the sound system and video equipment.



all the music for the weekend, also played her violin.



13) Willis Schlenker, DDS, associate professor of orthodontics, was a familiar pleasure, playing an old hymn tune on his saxaphone.




