### Use of Norton moves closer

The use of the 20 operatory dental clinic on the former Norton Air Force Base is moving ever closer to realization. With 17 of the operatories still fully equipped, it should take only a very short time to move from the planning stage to the patient treatment stage once the building is finally released by the U.S. Government.

We have been told that all documents are in place, but the U.S. Department of Education refuses to release the building to Loma Linda University until a fuel spill, adjacent to the building, is cleaned up and certified as clear of any hazardous waste. In the meantime, clinic administration continues to work with

the School of Public Health and the SAC clinics to plan for the use of the dental clinic. It is most likely that the initial use will be for pediatric dentistry, as several potential funding mechanisms appear to be available for the treatment of children.

One avenue being actively explored is cooperation with the Assistance League of San Bernardino, which currently operates a dental clinic for underprivileged children. There is also an application pending for the Federally Qualified Health Clinic. These clinics are unique in that they include dentistry as a part of their service, and services are funded at full government reimbursement rates.



Several current faculty members and several other former faculty or alumni have expressed an interest in having a part in the management and instruction facets of this clinic. William Heisler, DDS, associate dean for clinic administration, has stated that the addition of this facility to our predoctoral clinics will enhance the LLUSD teaching program in the following ways:

1) It will help to alleviate the shortage of chairs in the clinic.

2) It will give the students exposure to the delivery of dentistry under "managed care" contracts as opposed to "fee for service" treatment which is currently employed.

"We are all anxiously awaiting the completion of the government red tape so that this additional clinic can become reality," says Dr. Heisler.

### Pre-professional advisors meet

The School of Dentistry welcomed pre-professional advisors from the Adventist colleges across the U.S. and Canada at a February 23 workshop.

Dan Zunitch, SD'95, presented a devotional, followed by breakfast in the student lounge.

# Dental alumni student loans awarded

The dental alumni student loan fund committee has announced that 122 dental students have been awarded \$439,500 in tuition loans for the 1994-95 year. This is the second largest amount given in a single year since the program began in 1987.

A total of 376 students have received loans from this special fund sponsored by the School of Dentistry Alumni Association. "Over \$2,393,000 has been awarded and we are pleased to see the first of these loans being repaid promptly so that additional students can benefit," noted Hank Mercado, SD'77, president of the Century Club, which coordinates the Annual Fund campaign to support the loan program.

# Little house on Taylor St. provides services

Those of you who are new to the School of Dentistry may have passed a little house at 24868 Taylor Street that has a sign on the front lawn reading "The Graphics Studio—School of Dentistry."

We are a service, on a requisition basis, to the School of Dentistry, providing state-of-the-art audio-visual output to assist teachers in their classroom presentations, and helping the staff with their graphic needs, as well as producing visual aids for research presentations.

Some of our services:

- computer slides and print-outs in black & white and color
- publication service for newsletters, brochures, and press releases
- posters, cartoons, and artwork for slides and publication
- complete black & white darkroom facilities
- slide duplicating and slides from flat copy, and small object photography

• video production, editing, and duplicating

Several have asked particularly about our computer graphic slides. Graphics will image slides from your file or design them for you.

Supported programs in the studio include Persuasion and Powerpoint for Mac, and Persuasion for Windows and Powerpoint for Windows for PC.

You can bring a disk to the Graphics Studio or send your slide file over the network. To use the network: on a computer connected to the campus network, transfer your file to the Dental server, into the director named "GRAPHICS" inside the directory named "DEPTS."

Or, you may send your file directly to the Graphics Studio by selecting the Graphics Studio 48008 server. Place the slides in the folder "Computer Graphics—Richard T."

Cost is \$2.45 per slide imaged from your file, or \$5 and up when we design and image for you. For more info, call Richard Tinker at x48008.


