THE MACE. Traditionally the ceremonial mace represents the authority vested in the highest officer of a governing body. In an educational institution, the authority symbolized by the mace derives from respect for the authority of knowledge and for the rights and value of the individual. Thus, the leader of an academic community assumes the obligation and challenge to ensure for its members a climate conducive to growth in knowledge and grace.

The construction of the ceremonial mace of Loma Linda University evokes further ideas. Its two metals, bronze and aluminum, suggest the values of lessons both ancient and contemporary. Rather than lying prone, an instrument to be wielded, this mace stands upright in celebration of the free human spirit. Its open construction implies free exposure to questions, ideas, and conflict. The eight vertical supporting elements (at three points bound together as for strength and stability in unity) uphold a graceful oval that points outward to the universe, the province of inquiry.

Within the oval, the University seal appears to float unfettered. The staff of Aesculapius on the left represents all fields of the healing arts and sciences. The broken sword on the right implies mercy in the sense of selflessness and restraint from acts and attitudes of self-aggrandizement and destructiveness. The open book suggests God the Word as the basis for all truth. The lighted torch symbolizes the illuminating power of knowledge and the University's central purpose of forwarding and perpetuating good through the enlightened, searching, caring mind and conscience of the individual.



Preceding the president's party, the faculty, and the candidates for degrees are the University commencement marshal and/or associate marshals, carrying the University mace and batons. Loma Linda University's colors — gold and purple — are represented in the marshals' gold-colored gowns trimmed with purple velvet.

Immediately following the president's party in the procession are members of the University's Board of Trustees. A member of the board is identified by a purple gown with gold velvet trim.

THE SPEAKERS



BENJAMIN S. CARSON

Director, Division of Pediatric Neurosurgery
Codirector, Section of Neurosurgical Oncology
Assistant Professor of Neurological Surgery, Oncology, and Pediatrics
The Johns Hopkins University and Hospital

Dr. Carson is a graduate of Yale University (B.A. 1973) and the University of Michigan (M.D. 1977). He interned at the Halsted Surgical Service at the Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland, while concurrently completing a fellowship in general surgery at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine (1977-78). Dr. Carson subsequently completed a fellowship in neurosurgery at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine (1978-83) and residencies in neurosurgery at Johns Hopkins Hospital (1978-82), the Loch Raven Veterans Administration Hospital in Baltimore (1980), and the Baltimore City Hospitals (1981). He was chief resident and fellow in neurological surgery at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine and Hospital (1982-83). From 1983-84 Dr. Carson was the senior registrar in neurosurgery at the Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital in Western Australia. During that year he gained the surgical experience it would have taken him ten years to obtain had he remained in Maryland. Upon returning to Johns Hopkins University and Hospital in 1984, he was appointed to his present posts, with the exception that he was named assistant professor of pediatrics in 1987. Dr. Carson holds membership in several professional and scientific societies. His list of publications in scientific journals is long as is his list of honors and awards for academic excellence and public service. He has lectured throughout the United States, Europe, and Japan. Internationally he is best known as the leader of the surgical team that in 1987 performed the first successful separation of craniopagus (joined at the head) siamese twins, the Binder infants of West Germany. Since then he has been sought as a consultant for such operations worldwide. Dr. Carson will present his address at the Confering of Degrees for the School of Medicine.

RICHARD C. OLIVER

Professor of Periodontology and Health Ecology
School of Dentistry and Center for Health Services Research
University of Minnesota

Dr. Oliver is a graduate of the University of Minnesota (D.D.S. 1953). Following graduation he completed a dental internship at Fitzsimmons Army Hospital, served in the United States Air Force, and established a general dentistry practice. In 1962 he earned the Master of Science degree from Loma Linda University and was appointed to the University's faculty, on which he served as professor of periodontics and director of postgraduate periodontics until 1975. In 1975 he was appointed dean of the University of Southern California's School of Dentistry. He left this position in 1979 to accept appointment as dean of the School of Dentistry, University of Minnesota, a post which he filled until 1986. Dr. Oliver's contributions to the profession cover a broad spectrum of activities, including: consultant to the Division of Dentistry of the U. S. Public Health Service; chairman of the Program Advisory Committee of the National Institute of Dental Research; past president of the Periodontal Research Group of the International Association for Dental Research; chairman of the Council of Deans; president of the American Association of Dental Schools; editor of professional journals; and member of numerous boards, committees, and associations. He has lectured throughout the world in the fields of periodontics, preventive dentistry, and planning for dentistry and dental education. Dr. Oliver will present his address at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Dentistry.



ARTHUR F. GLASSER

Dean Emeritus and Senior Professor of Theology,
Mission, and East Asian Studies
School of World Mission
Fuller Theological Seminary

Dr. Glasser earned degrees from Cornell University College of Civil Engineering (C.E. 1936), Faith Theological Seminary (B.D. 1942), and Union Theological Seminary (S.T.M. 1972). In 1965 he received the D.D. (Hon.) from Covenant College and Theological Seminary. From 1942-45 he served as a chaplain in the United States Navy, and from 1946-51 he served as missionary to China under the authorization of Overseas Missionary Fellowship. Upon returning to the United States he began a career in teaching, which has included appointments at Columbia Bible College (1951-55), Westminster Theological Seminary (1967-69), and Fuller Theological Seminary (1970-80). He has also filled administrative positions: assistant home director and home director, Overseas Mission Fellowship (1955-69); and dean, Fuller Theological Seminary School of World Mission (1970-80). His publications include articles and reviews in professional journals and several books. Dr. Glasser's address will be presented at the Conferring of Degrees for the Graduate School.

KATHLEEN F. O'CONNOR

Associate Professor of Nursing (on leave)
School of Nursing, Loma Linda University

Ms. O'Connor has earned degrees from St. Mary's College (B.S. 1964); Graduate School of Nursing, New York Medical College (M.S. 1968); and School of Nursing, University of California at San Francisco (M.S. 1974). Her professional career has included positions as medical technologist; staff nurse, head nurse, director of nursing practice; continuing education specialist, inservice educator, and teacher at the university level. In 1979 she joined the staff of Loma Linda University's School of Nursing as assistant professor and was appointed associate professor in that school in 1982. From 1984-88 she served as chairman of the Department of Medical/Surgical Nursing. Ms. O'Connor holds membership in several professional organizations and is active as a speaker and consultant, particularly in the area of oncology nursing. She has been the recipient of academic honors and has been recognized for her teaching and clinical excellence as well. She is currently on study leave from the University. Ms. O'Connor will deliver her address at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Nursing.



CARROL S. SMALL

Professor of Pathology
School of Medicine, Loma Linda University

Dr. Small earned the Doctor of Medicine degree from Loma Linda University (then College of Medical Evangelists) in 1934. Following graduation he served at Christian Medical College in Vellore, India, for seven years. During nearly five decades of service to Loma Linda University, Dr. Small has many times been honored by the University and the School of Medicine Alumni Association for professional and personal excellence. In 1984 he was the recipient of the Distinguished University Service Award. His efforts on behalf of Loma Linda University have been numerous. Prominent among his endeavors was his coordination of the fund-raising activities for the \$8.5 million Alumni Hall for the Basic Sciences, which was completed in 1984. Dr. Small will give his address at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Public Health.

ALICE S. PETROSSIAN

Director, Intercultural Education Department
Glendale Unified School District, K-12
Chair, California Commission on Teacher Credentialing

Mrs. Petrossian is an alumna of California State University, Los Angeles, where she earned the Bachelor of Arts (1969) and the Master of Arts (1979) degrees. Her professional career has included teaching at all education levels, elementary through college, and administering educational programs. In addition to her full administrative and teaching schedule, she serves as chair of the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing and as member on a number of boards and committees. Mrs. Petrossian is a recognized authority in the field of education and has been keynote speaker and made presentations at numerous conferences at the state and national levels. She is also active in community service and has been the recipient of several service, academic, and professional honors. Mrs. Petrossian will present her address at the combined Conferring of Degrees for the College of Arts and Sciences and the Schools of Education and Business and Management.



DOUGLAS F. WELEBIR

Attorney
Law Firm of Welebir, Lester, Garza, & Macomber

Mr. Welebir is a graduate of Loma Linda University (B.A. 1962) and the University of Southern California (J.D. 1965). He was admitted to the bar of the state of California in 1966, the District of Columbia in 1967, and the United States Supreme Court in 1971. His professional background includes research assistant to a justice of the California Court of Appeals, 4th District (1966); and deputy public defender for San Bernardino County (1967). He is currently a partner in the law firm of Welebir, Lester, Garza, & Macomber. From 1970-73 he served as mayor of the city of Loma Linda. Mr. Welebir, who is a member of several bar associations, has taught courses in his area of specialization and has presented related lectures. Mr. Welebir's address will be given at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Allied Health Professions.

THE HONOREES



MERLE COLLINS

Councilor, Loma Linda University

Mr. Collins was born in Alfred, New York, and raised in Battle Creek, Michigan. His family worked on an 88-acre farm owned by C. W. Post of cereal fame. Mr. Collins and a brother moved to California in 1912 to farm in the Coachella Valley. He then moved to San Diego at the suggestion of a sister to take a nursing course at Paradise Valley Sanitarium. He withdrew from the program one year before graduation but continued to work at the sanitarium in order to provide financial assistance for his sister who was enrolled in the same program. In the 1920s he moved to Glendale, where he joined the police force as a motorcycle officer. In the 1930s he bought three acres in Temple City and built a rest home which opened in 1938 with forty-two patients and a staff of seven. The operation of his rest home, which was the ninth built in southern California, helped to change the negative image previously accorded these facilities. Nine years later the Santa Anita Convalescent Hospital had grown to a capacity for 622 patients and employed 378 persons. Mr. Collins bought the surrounding property for staff housing, and the complex eventually covered seven acres. He sold the hospital and houses in 1971. Since his retirement, Mr. Collins has traveled extensively. In 1982 he was invited to become a member of the University Councilors, a group of business and professional persons in North America who advise the administration on issues and support special endeavors. Mr. Collins has financially supported several projects at the University because of his interest in students. His latest gift was to the School of Medicine Scholarship Fund. The DISTINGUISHED HUMANITARIAN AWARD will be presented to Mr. Collins at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Medicine.



G. GORDON HADLEY

Director, Health and Temperance Department
General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists

Dr. Hadley is an alumnus of Columbia Union College and Loma Linda University (College of Medical Evangelists, M.D. 1944). He completed an internship at Washington Sanitarium and Hospital in Washington, D.C., and finished a residency in pathology at Loma Linda Sanitarium and Hospital. In 1949 he began teaching as an instructor in pathology at the Los Angeles County and the White Memorial hospitals. He was subsequently appointed director of the clinical laboratory at the White Memorial Hospital. In 1955 Dr. Hadley and his family began their first of several tours as missionaries to India and Afghanistan. Dr. Hadley taught pathology at the Velore Medical College, Velore, India, until 1958. He then traveled to Afghanistan for the World Health Organization on three occasions to teach pathology: 1960-62, 1963-64, and 1970-72. At the same time he worked with Indiana University to coordinate the medical teams that went to Afghanistan until the dissolution of the government in 1975. He returned to Loma Linda University in 1975 to become associate dean for student affairs in the School of Medicine. Two years later he was appointed dean of the school, a position in which he served until 1986, when he accepted his present appointment in Washington, D.C. The DISTINGUISHED UNIVERSITY SERVICE AWARD will be presented to Dr. Hadley at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Medicine.

A GRAHAM MAXWELL

Emeritus Professor of New Testament
School of Religion, Loma Linda University

Dr. Maxwell earned the B.A. (1943) and M.A. (1944) degrees from Pacific Union College. He remained at his alma mater as an instructor in biblical languages. In 1952 he was appointed associate professor and chairman of the Department of Biblical Languages. He received the Ph.D. degree in 1959 from the University of Chicago Divinity School in the field of New Testament and that same year was appointed professor and chairman of the Division of Religion and Biblical Studies at Pacific Union College. He held these posts until coming to Loma Linda University in 1961. While at Loma Linda University he held the positions of professor of New Testament and director of the Division of Religion. He retired from full-time duties in 1988 after nearly three decades of distinguished contributions to the University through his teaching, scholarship, and service. He is author of *You Can Trust the Bible, I Want to Be Free*, and *Can God Be Trusted?*; and was a contributor to the *Seventh-day Adventist Bible Commentary* on the book of Romans. He is an ordained minister of the Seventh-day Adventist church and holds membership in several professional societies. Dr. Maxwell will receive the DISTINGUISHED UNIVERSITY SERVICE AWARD at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Medicine.



TRYGVE OPSAHL

Private practice physician

Dr. Opsahl is a graduate of Washington Missionary College (B.A. 1949) and Loma Linda University (College of Medical Evangelists, M.D. 1954). Subsequent to a two-year internship and two years in the United States Navy Medical Corps, he completed a four-year surgery residency in Indianapolis. Dr. Opsahl later served as a missionary to Trinidad. When he returned to the United States, he established a successful surgery practice, which he has maintained for thirty-five years. During the more than three decades since his days as a medical student, he has remained mindful of the University's role in providing stability and hope for the future through the instilling of Christian values in young people. He has considered it a privilege to support the educational endeavors of the School of Medicine by establishing endowments which will be used to fund scholarships, capital enterprises, and other needed projects. A special University presentation will be made to Dr. Opsahl at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Medicine.

RONALD E. BUELL

Emeritus Professor of Endodontics
School of Dentistry, Loma Linda University

Dr. Buell earned the D.M.D. degree from the University of Oregon in 1932. He began his practice of dentistry in Santa Ana, California, immediately following graduation. In 1943 he entered the military, serving as a dentist in the United States Army until 1946. Dr. Buell joined the faculty of the School of Dentistry, Loma Linda University, in 1956 but continued a general private practice in Santa Ana, which was later limited to endodontics. In 1959 he became the first endodontic specialist in Orange County. Dr. Buell was made a Diplomate of the Board of the American Association of Endodontists, adding distinction and credibility to the Graduate Endodontics Program which he subsequently directed. Dr. Buell will be presented the DISTINGUISHED UNIVERSITY SERVICE AWARD at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Dentistry.



LOIS E. McKEE

Professor of Office Management, retired
College of Arts and Sciences, Loma Linda University

Dr. McKee is an alumna of La Sierra College (B.S. 1949), Mississippi State University (M.E. 1958), and the University of Nebraska (ED.D. 1968). Soon after graduating from La Sierra College, she accepted a dual appointment at the college as dean of women and instructor in secretarial science. From 1958-63 she taught business at Hawaiian Mission Academy. In 1963 she accepted a position as assistant professor in the Department of Secretarial Science at Union College in Nebraska. Dr. McKee returned to La Sierra College in 1967 as assistant professor of secretarial administration. She was promoted to associate professor two years later at what had now become Loma Linda University, College of Arts and Sciences. In 1974 she was made professor of secretarial and business education, with a title change in 1981 to professor of office management. She served as chairman of the Department of Office Management from 1972-82 and again from 1986-87. Dr. McKee's seminars and workshops in office management have been in great demand, not only in North America but overseas as well; and her contributions to educational standards have extended beyond Seventh-day Adventist circles through her membership and offices held in several educational, honor, and professional societies. Her retirement last year marked the end of four decades of teaching and administration in the field of secretarial and business education. An endowed scholarship has been established by her family in her honor to be awarded to secretarial, office management, or business education majors. Dr. McKee will receive the DISTINGUISHED UNIVERSITY SERVICE AWARD at the combined Conferring of Degrees for the College of Arts and Sciences and the Schools of Education and Business and Management.

MILTON J. MURRAY

Director of Philanthropic Service for Institutions
General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists

Mr. Murray is an alumnus of Loma Linda University. During nearly four decades, his professional life has been dedicated to medical and educational institutional advancement. He has established several public relations and development programs and has served as consultant to more than fifty institutions on two continents in twelve countries. Mr. Murray has also been instrumental in establishing four funds: the \$1.4 million Hospital Development Fund in 1979; the \$4.3 million Business Executives' Challenge to Alumni (BECA) Fund in 1980; a \$2 million fund for Adventist secondary education in 1986; and a \$650,000 fund for STEP/UP, a project designed to attract young people to the field of philanthropy. It is estimated that during his professional career he has directed programs and directly influenced institutions in acquiring approximately \$60 million. He actively promotes the interests of the profession in a variety of ways, from chairing various development organization committees to publication of such philanthropy-related pieces as the booklet "Accent on Philanthropy" and the "Page-A-Day Calendar — Giving Is True Loving." Mr. Murray has been the recipient of several awards, including the highest honor bestowed on fundraisers by the National Association for Hospital Development — the Si Seymour Award. The title UNIVERSITY ALUMNUS will be conferred on Mr. Murray at the combined Conferring of Degrees for the College of Arts and Sciences and the Schools of Education and Business and Management.



THOMAS M. AND VIOLET J. ZAPARA

Life Support Products, Inc.

Mr. and Mrs. Zapara are alumni of La Sierra College. Mr. Zapara began his professional career in sales for a pharmaceutical company and Mrs. Zapara taught in the Seventh-day Adventist school system for five years after graduation. In 1952 they formed their own company, Zee Medical Products, which specialized in first-aid products to industry. In 1982 Zee Medical Products was sold. The Zaparas retained a small emergency medical portion, which they have built into the worldwide concern known as Life Support Products, Inc. In addition to meeting the demands of chairing the board of Life Support Products, Inc., Mr. Zapara also finds time for numerous non-business activities, including membership on the Board of Trustees and Executive Committee of Loma Linda University, member of University Councilors, president of Adventist Layman's Services and Industries Missions, Inc., and member of several other boards and organizations. Mr. Zapara was the recipient of the University's Distinguished Humanitarian Award in 1981.

In 1988, as a result of a generous gift given by Mr. and Mrs. Zapara, the Distinguished Undergraduate Teaching Awards were established by the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. These awards will be presented annually through 1992 to three outstanding college/university teachers on each North American Division campus in recognition of teaching excellence and devotion to the objectives of education in the Christian context. In addition to these thirty-six annual awards, a national award will also be presented to the most outstanding teacher in each of three areas: the sciences, the humanities, and the professional disciplines. In spite of their varied and far-flung business and civic interests, the Zaparas agree that their shared hobby is their three granddaughters. A special University presentation will be made to Mr. and Mrs. Zapara at the combined Conferring of Degrees for the College of Arts and Sciences and the Schools of Education and Business and Management.

THE THOMAS AND VIOLET ZAPARA DISTINGUISHED UNDERGRADUATE TEACHING AWARDS

The ZAPARA AWARDS, established in 1988 as the result of a generous gift given by Thomas and Violet Zapara, are presented in recognition of teaching excellence and devotion to the objectives of education in the Christian context. Thirty-six \$1,000 awards will be presented annually through 1992 to three outstanding teachers on each North American Division campus; and a national award of \$3,000 will be presented to the most outstanding teacher in each of three areas: the sciences, the humanities, and the professional disciplines.
