THE MACE. Traditionally the ceremonial mace represents the authority vested in the highest officer of a governing body. In an educational institution, the authority symbolized by the mace derives from respect for the authority of knowledge and for the rights and value of the individual. Thus, the leader of an academic community assumes the obligation and challenge to ensure for its members a climate conducive to growth in knowledge and grace.

The construction of the ceremonial mace of Loma Linda University evokes further ideas. Its two metals, bronze and aluminum, suggest the values of lessons both ancient and contemporary. Rather than lying prone, an instrument to be wielded, this mace stands upright in celebration of the free human spirit. Its open construction implies free exposure to questions, ideas, and conflict. The eight vertical supporting elements (at three points bound together as for strength and stability in unity) uphold a graceful oval that points outward to the universe, the province of inquiry.

Within the oval, the University seal appears to float unfettered. The staff of Aesculapius on the left represents all fields of the healing arts and sciences. The broken sword on the right implies mercy in the sense of selflessness and restraint from acts and attitudes of self-aggrandizement and destructiveness. The open book suggests God the Word as the basis for all truth. The lighted torch symbolizes the illuminating power of knowledge and the University's central purpose of forwarding and perpetuating good through the enlightened, searching, caring mind and conscience of the individual.



Preceding the president's party, the faculty, and the candidates for degrees are the University commencement marshal and/or associate marshals, carrying the University mace and batons. Loma Linda University's colors — gold and purple — are represented in the marshals' gold-colored gowns trimmed with purple velvet.

Immediately following the president's party in the procession are members of the University's Board of Trustees. A member of the board is identified by a purple gown with gold velvet trim.

THE SPEAKERS



PAUL W. BRAND

Senior Consultant, Gillis W. Long Hansen's Disease Center (formerly National Hansen's Disease Center)
Carville, Louisiana

Emeritus Clinical Professor of Surgery
University of Washington, Seattle

Dr. Brand completed his medical and surgical training at London University in London, England. In 1946 he returned to India where he had spent his childhood as the son of missionary parents, to teach at Christian Medical College, an international Christian enterprise involving more than fifty Protestant missions and other organizations from more than a dozen countries. As a professor of orthopaedic surgery who specialized in hand reconstruction, his primary research interest centered on reconstruction of healed leprosy patients. He became the first surgeon in the world to demonstrate the feasibility of prevention and correction of leprosy deformities. He served for a time as director of orthopaedic surgery for the Leprosy Mission and as consultant to the American Leprosy Mission. After nineteen years of service in India, he accepted appointment to the Rehabilitation Branch at the National Hansen's Disease Center in Carville, Louisiana, the only leprosy hospital in the continental United States. Dr. Brand, now retired, currently serves as emeritus clinical professor of surgery at the University of Washington (Seattle, Washington). In recognition of his extensive contributions to his profession and indicative of the high esteem in which he is held, he has been the recipient of numerous awards and honors, including the Distinguished Service Award and the Surgeon General's Medallion from the Department of Health and Human Services, Public Health Service; his designation as "Pioneer in Hand Surgery" by the International Federation of Societies for Surgery of the Hand; his appointment by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth as Commander of the Order of the British Empire (C.B.E.) in 1961; and his election to serve as president of the International Christian Medical and Dental Association in 1986. Dr. Brand will deliver his address at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Medicine.

GERALDINE T. MORROW

President of the American Dental Association

Dr. Morrow, a 1956 graduate of Tufts University School of Dental Medicine, began her professional career in Alaska as an intern with the Indian Health Service, the agency responsible for the health-care needs of the indigenous population. Her distinguished career to date has included practicing general dentistry, providing innovative and influential leadership in dental education, and holding major offices in organized dentistry at the local, state, and national levels. As dean of the University of Alaska's Allied Health Sciences School for more than a decade, Dr. Morrow was instrumental in the development of nontraditional programs to expand educational and career opportunities for dental assistants and hygienists. As director of dental programs at Anchorage Community College, she was a leading force in obtaining legislative and public support for construction of an allied health science building. Dr. Morrow developed and founded the Delta Dental Corporation of Alaska and served as its president for three years. The corporation managed Alaska's welfare and Medicaid programs during the years of her leadership. She served for six years as the American Dental Association's (ADA) Eleventh District Trustee, representing dentists in Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Washington, and Alaska. She also served on the ADA's Council on Dental Health and Health Planning and chaired this council in 1983-84. In addition to her commitment to dentistry and the public's health, her service-oriented work has included active involvement in a broad range of activities to develop cultural resources in Anchorage and enhance the life of her community. Dr. Morrow will present her address at the Confering of Degrees for the School of Dentistry.



MARIE J. COWAN

Professor of Physiological Nursing, Pathology, and Medicine (Cardiology)
Associate Dean of Research and Practice
School of Nursing, University of Washington at Seattle

Dr. Cowan has earned degrees from the University of Washington at Seattle (B.S. in nursing, M.S. in physiology and biophysics, PH.D. in pathology and physiology/biophysics). Her professional career has included positions as charge, staff, and public health nurse. Since refocusing from professional to academic nursing in 1972, when she was appointed to the faculty of the University of Washington School of Nursing, she has filled faculty appointments as assistant, associate, and full professor; as well as the administrative position of associate dean of research practice. Dr. Cowan is an extensively published author in the area of cardiovascular nursing, contributing both to professional journals and books on this subject; a regularly funded National Institutes of Health and Department of Health and Human Services researcher; a cardiovascular nursing-related consultant; and a much sought after speaker or presenter at workshops, symposia, and conferences throughout the United States. She is a member of professional organizations and serves several organizations as board, council, or committee member or as chair. Her academic and research excellence and contributions to her profession have been recognized through the many awards and honors she has received. Dr. Cowan will present her address at the Confering of Degrees for the Graduate School.

O. MARIE HENRY

United States Deputy Surgeon General
Chief Nurse Officer, United States Public Health Service

Dr. Henry earned the Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree from the University of Virginia (Charlottesville); and the Master of Science in Nursing and the Doctor of Nursing Science degrees from The Catholic University of America (Washington, D.C.). Her career in nursing, rather than being limited, has followed several paths: hospital charge nurse; public health department nurse and supervisor; army nurse corps officer; Visiting Nurses' Association supervisor and consultant; nursing practice consultant to individuals, groups, and agencies — including the nationwide Nurse Practitioner Program; chief of the Nursing Practice Branch, the national program to improve the quality of nursing practice and health care; chief of the Clinical and Professional Activities Branch, which administers the national program activities of all National Health Service Corps providers; director, Division of Nursing Bureau of Health Professions; Public Health Service chief nurse officer; and deputy surgeon general for the United States Public Health Service. Dr. Henry holds membership in a number of professional nursing organizations, many of which she serves as a committee or panel member; and she maintains appointment on the faculties of several universities. Numerous honors, commendations, and awards have been presented to her for outstanding service and achievement. Through articles published, papers presented, and addresses given, she remains a respected voice on the cutting edge of her profession. Dr. Henry will present her address at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Nursing.



MERVYN G. HARDINGE

Emeritus Dean, Emeritus Professor
School of Public Health, Loma Linda University

Dr. Hardinge was born in Calcutta, India, of English parents. After graduation from college in England, he migrated to the United States, where he completed his medical education, receiving the Doctor of Medicine degree from Loma Linda University in 1942. Shortly after graduation he was invited to join the faculty of the School of Medicine, Loma Linda University. He taught at the University for the next thirty-five years — twenty-three years in the School of Medicine and twelve years in the School of Public Health, which he founded. He received specialty training in the fields of nutrition (DR.P.H. Harvard University) and pharmacology (PH.D Stanford University). In addition to faculty appointments, he also served administratively as chairman of the Department of Pharmacology in the School of Medicine from 1957-67; and as dean of the School of Public Health from 1967-1977. After retirement from the University, he answered a call to fill the position of director of the Health Department at the world headquarters of the Seventh-day Adventist church, then in Washington, D.C. Currently enjoying a second retirement, Dr. Hardinge keeps busy with his hobby of preparing written and visual materials to alter unhealthful lifestyles. He has published many original scientific papers in the fields of nutrition and pharmacology. He was for a time editor of the lay journal *Life and Health*, now *Abundant Life*, and is a popular writer in lay health magazines. Dr. Hardinge will give his address at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Public Health.

DONALD G. PURSLEY

Vice President for Financial Administration
Loma Linda University

Dr. Pursley holds degrees from Nebraska State Teachers' College (B.S.E. in health/physical education and mathematics), George Institute of Technology (M.S. in computer science), and George Washington University (D.B.A.). His professional career includes teaching at the high school and college levels; officer in charge of U.S. Air Force Flight Instrument Schools in Europe, Southeast Asia, the continental United States, and Alaska; administrator in the areas of education and research for the U. S. Air Force Academy; financial administration officer for higher education. He retired with the rank of colonel from the Air Force in 1984 after twenty-three years of service. Dr. Pursley has authored or coauthored publications on database administration, the role of management in educational technology, and data administration. While in the military he was awarded the Commander's Action Medal, the Federal Women's Program Award, and twice received the Meritorious Service Medal. Dr. Pursley will give his address at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Allied Health Professions.

PAUL W. BRAND

Founder/Chairman of the Board/CEO of McNeilus Truck and Manufacturing, Inc.
Dodge Center, Minnesota

Mr. McNeilus, an alumnus of Oak Park Academy in Nevada, Iowa, and the recipient of an Honorary Doctor of Laws degree from Southwestern Adventist College in Keene, Texas, provides an enviable record of personal accomplishments, willing service, and generous giving. He has drawn upon his experience and expertise to enhance the church as a member of the boards of several educational institutions (Andrews University, Oakwood College, Union College); board member of Adventist World Radio; local church board and conference executive committee member; and member of the Committee of Soviet Affairs and the SDA Commission on USSR. His interests are widespread and have led to active involvement with various education, publishing, church building, evangelistic, and humanitarian projects and programs in fifty-two countries. In addition to contributions to corporate efforts, he is equally solicitous of the welfare of individuals and enables their efforts toward worthy goals. In recognition of his personal qualities, in admiration of his endeavors on behalf of individuals and the church, and for outreaches that span the globe, Mr. McNeilus will be presented the Loma Linda University Distinguished General Service Award at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Public Health.

JAMES D. BROWN

Mr. Brown has established a trust to benefit the Endowed Scholarship Fund for students of African descent.

HOWARD AND IRENE PETERSON

Mr. and Mrs. Peterson, former patients at Loma Linda University Medical Center, have provided to the School of Medicine a trust annuity for research primarily in the areas of oncology and rheumatology, as well as additional unrestricted funds for research in other areas.

NORMAN J. WOODS

Immediate Past President, Loma Linda University

Dr. Woods, immediate past president of this University, began his professional career in the state of Washington as assistant dean of men at Auburn Academy and later as associate dean and dean of men at Walla Walla College. Continuing his work in education administration, Dr. Woods moved to California to become dean of students at Loma Linda University in 1966, the beginning of nearly two and one-half decades of service to this institution. Administrative appointments during his tenure here included assistant dean for admissions and student affairs, School of Dentistry; associate dean for admissions and student affairs, School of Medicine; interim dean of the Graduate School; vice president for academic administration; and president of the University. Among his additional special appointments were Board of Directors, American Association of Presidents of Independent Colleges and Universities; Board of Regents, General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists; and liaison officer, Western Association of Schools and Colleges. In addition to a heavy administrative load, Dr. Woods also served the University in concurrent academic appointments in the School of Dentistry as instructor in social dentistry, and as assistant and associate professor of preventive and community dentistry. His administration was particularly challenged to make decisions which prioritized as its ultimate norm and highest goal the viability of this academic community. In addition to making those decisions which allowed this institution the opportunity to refocus on our founding principles and mission, he has left behind a dream in the process of being realized — the Recreation and Wellness Center which will add a much needed comprehensive, centrally located facility to meet a wide variety of student, campus, and community needs. The Distinguished University Service Award will be presented to Dr. Woods at the Conferring of Degrees for the Schools of Medicine and of Dentistry.



GAINES R. PARTRIDGE

Dean of Student Affairs, Loma Linda University

Dr. Partridge joined the Loma Linda University academic community in 1971 with a background of nearly three decades of service to the church through education. He had served as teacher and principal at the elementary and academy levels in Lincoln, Nebraska; Chicago, Illinois; and Los Angeles, California; and as college professor and administrator in Huntsville, Alabama; Omaha, Nebraska; and South Lancaster, Massachusetts. During twenty-one years at this institution, he has exerted his influence to effect a number of important changes. As administrator in the area of student affairs, he has played an integral role in creating and nurturing the diverse, active, vibrant student community for which the University is widely known. The Associated Students of Loma Linda University (ASLLU) was established in response to his vision of a student government that would have an interest and a voice in institutional governance. In addition, he encouraged and actively worked toward greater ethnic diversity within the University and helped to heighten the attention of administration and others to the needs of minority students. During the past two decades the number of minority graduates from this institution has increased significantly. The Black Alumni of Loma Linda University (BALL), established under his sponsorship, continues to develop endowment funds for minority scholarships. Included among his several legacies to Loma Linda University is the annual Fine Arts Festival, which he established in 1973 and which remains one of the University's most popular events — enhancing communities beyond the institution's borders. Another is the sculpture of the Good Samaritan, commissioned by him of artist Alan Collins, which is centrally located on the campus and has come to symbolize the caring, healing ministry of this institution. Dr. Partridge will receive the Distinguished University Service Award at the Conferring of Degrees for the Schools of Medicine and of Allied Health Professions.

T. GRACE EMORI

Nurse Director, United States Public Health Service

Ms. Emori is an alumna of the College of Medical Evangelists (now Loma Linda University, B.S. 1960, M.S. 1965). Her professional career has included hospital staff nurse at Loma Linda University Medical Center; assistant professor of nursing at Atlantic Union College (South Lancaster, Massachusetts); and nurse epidemiologist at Loma Linda University Medical Center and at the Center for Disease Control (CDC) in Atlanta, Georgia. At the CDC she has served as assistant project chief for a study on nosocomial infection control and as chief of surveillance activity in the hospital infections program. She is currently nurse director for the United States Public Health Service (USPHS). Ms. Emori was honored as Outstanding Alumna of the Year, Loma Linda University School of Nursing in 1983 and received the Outstanding Service Medal from the USPHS in 1985. Her tenure as president of the School of Nursing Alumni Association in 1970 and her current membership on the University's Board of Trustees for a second term have provided numerous opportunities for service on behalf of this institution. The title University Alumna of the Year will be conferred on Ms. Emori at the Conferring of Degrees for the School of Nursing.



ADANETCH KIDANEMARIAM

Minister of Health, Ethiopia

As minister of health for Ethiopia, Dr. Kidanemariam holds the highest leadership position in health in that country. She is an alumna of Syracuse University where she earned a bachelor's degree in nursing, Columbia University where she was awarded a master's degree, and Loma Linda University School of Public Health (LLUSPH) where she earned the Master of Public Health and Doctor of Public Health degrees. She taught in the nursing and medical departments at Addis Ababa University and also served there as chair of the Department of Community Health. She was honored at the Crawford Memorial Lecture (LLUSPH) for her outstanding contributions to the field of public health in Ethiopia — particularly in the areas of women and children, community disease control, and long-range strategic planning in health care. The title University Alumna of the Year will be conferred on Dr. Kidanemariam, and she will also be honored as School of Public Health Alumna of the Year.

B. LYN BEHRENS

President, Loma Linda University

Dr. Behrens received her medical training at Sydney University in Australia, where she graduated in 1964. Following graduation she took a rotating internship at Royal Prince Alfred Hospital in Sydney, and entered a pediatric residency program at Sydney's Royal Alexander Hospital in 1965. She continued her pediatric education at Loma Linda University Medical Center in 1966 and subsequently served as chief resident at the Henrietta Egleston Hospital for Children in Atlanta, Georgia; and at the T. C. Thompson Children's Hospital in Chattanooga, Tennessee. In 1970 Dr. Behrens joined the faculty of the University's School of Medicine in the Department of Pediatrics. She was named director of the pediatric residency program in 1975, a position she held until 1981 when she entered a fellowship program in Colorado. She rejoined the School of Medicine faculty in 1984 as director of the pediatric residency program and vice chair of the Department of Pediatrics. In 1986 she was appointed dean of the School of Medicine, a position which she held until assuming her current post as president of the University. She was the recipient of the Wolfe Solomon Brown Prize for Anatomy and the Gilbert Phillips Memorial Prize for Neuroanatomy in 1960, was given the Clinical Teacher Award by the University's School of Medicine classes of 1971 and 1986, and was presented the American Academy of Pediatrics Section of Allergy and Immunology Award in 1982. Dr. Behrens will receive the School of Medicine's Distinguished Service Award.



KENNETH M. WICAL

Chief, Removable Prosthodontics
Professor, Restorative Dentistry
School of Dentistry, Loma Linda University

Dr. Wical earned his D.D.S. degree at the University of Southern California School of Dentistry in 1956. After two years of duty with the United States Public Health Service (USPHS), he was invited to join the faculty of Loma Linda University School of Dentistry in the Department of Restorative Dentistry, where he remained from 1958 through 1961. He then completed a second USPHS tour of duty, serving as dental officer in the Aleutian Islands (Pt. Barrow, Alaska). Subsequently, he established a dental practice in Keene, Texas, and for several years taught chemistry at Southwestern Adventist College. In 1966 he again accepted a faculty/administrative appointment with the School of Dentistry — this time as director of the newly constructed Monument Valley Dental Clinic, and was a key figure in developing a productive dental service in conjunction with Monument Valley Adventist Hospital. The dental clinic served as an extension campus of the School of Dentistry. Dr. Wical completed a postdoctoral program in prosthodontics at the University of Washington in 1973. He returned to this University where, from 1975-84 he served as chairman of dentistry's Department of Prosthodontics. He later served as assistant dean for clinical administration but chose in 1987 to return to full-time teaching. He is a Fellow of the American College of Dentists and is a member of the Omicron Kappa Upsilon national dental society, as well as numerous other professional organizations. He serves as a member of the editorial board of *The Journal of Prosthetic Dentistry*. Dr. Wical will receive the School of Dentistry's Distinguished Service Award.

PETER NELSON

Private Practice Dentist, San Luis Obispo, California

Dr. Nelson, who earned the D.D.S. degree from Loma Linda University School of Dentistry in 1970, has maintained a full-time private practice in San Luis Obispo since that time. He has served in numerous overseas dental service settings for periods of one to three months, in fifteen countries, and has been active in recruiting professional colleagues to provide similar service. He was president of the National Association of Seventh-day Adventist Dentists (NASDAD) in 1991. At the local church level he is a member of the Board of Elders and has chaired the board of the church's elementary school. Dr. Nelson will receive the School of Dentistry's Alumnus of the Year Award.



CLARICE WOODWARD

Interim Assistant Dean of the Graduate Program
School of Nursing, Loma Linda University

Mrs. Woodward earned the B.S. degree from the College of Medical Evangelists (now Loma Linda University) in 1960 and the M.S. degree from the University of California at Los Angeles in 1963. She has served in many key positions that have helped to mold the School of Nursing to what it is today: chair of the Department of Parent/Child Nursing (1970-73; 1977-88); associate dean for the graduate program in nursing (1973-74); major adviser for the parent/child nursing graduate program (1972-87); and chair of the Curriculum Committee (1980-87). She retired in 1987; but her retirement was recently interrupted when she consented to fill the position of interim assistant dean of the graduate program in nursing. During her interim deanship she has helped to establish two nurse practitioner/clinical nurse specialist programs in neonatal and pediatric critical care, and one clinical nurse specialist program in the adult and aging family. Mrs. Woodward will receive the School of Nursing's Distinguished Service Award.



JOAN BURGDORFF

Head Nurse, Operating Room
Loma Linda University Medical Center

Ms. Burgdorff graduated with a B.S. degree in nursing in 1967. She is currently head nurse in the operating room at Loma Linda University Medical Center. Although she has no children of her own, for many years she has served the University S.D.A. Church in Loma Linda in the children's divisions, where generations of children have learned about Jesus and their faith from her. Ms. Burgdorff will receive the School of Nursing's Alumna of the Year Award.

KAREN RADKE

Associate Professor of Nursing and of Physiology
University of Rochester, New York

But when fools are ready to advise me or to find fault with me, let me not listen to their folly. Let me be intent upon one thing, O Father of Mercy, to be always merciful to thy suffering children.

May there never rise in me the notion that I know enough, but give me strength and leisure and zeal to enlarge my knowledge. Our work is great and the mind of man presses forward forever. Thou hast chosen me in thy grace to watch over the life and death of thy creatures. I am about to fulfill my duties. Guide me in this immense work so that it may be of avail.
