

# The Current Report

# First step of ESP-SD completed

The first component of the Early Selection Program at LLUSD, established during the winter quarter of this school year, was successfully completed by Mueni Mutinga on August 18.

This program was established to identify promising students who have an interest in the profession of dentistry, and to provide opportunities for them to become better prepared for the competition for entrance and to ease their transition into the freshman year. The first college to become a partnership college in this program is Oakwood College.

Mueni was on the LLU campus for four weeks. During this time she completed a program through the Teaching Learning Center with Shirani Chand, EdD, director; a program in speed writing taught by Mary Ellen Montgomery from Chaffey College; a course in medical speed reading, developed and taught by Brian Bull, MD, dean of the School of Medicine; and religion coursework coordinated by Delbert Baker, PhD, director of diversity.

Laura Erlandson, SD'95, tutored Mueni in the laboratory, helping her get acquainted with dexterity and eyehand coordination. She was introduced to integrative care in the hospital with Wilber Alexander, PhD, special assistant to the president for spiritual life and wholeness. She attended several dental classes and shadowed graduate students in the pediatric clinic under the coordination of Melva Wyatt, DDS, assistant professor.




area. Shown here, Vic West, DDS, project organizer, and Rick Ricketts, DDS, donator of the library material, examine a new display.

Milos Boskovic, DDS, clinical assistant professor in implant dentistry and prosthodontics, just returned safely from a trip to his hometown of Belgrade in Serbia.

Dr. Boskovic was there when the NATO bombing started, but was not in the targeted area. He noted that one of the chief negotiators was also in Belgrade, ensuring the safety of that city.

He found Serbia flooded with over 200,000 refugees from the Krajina region, now Croatia. The airport also had heightened security.




