Campaign update: October 1, 1995




Alumni get press space

Program director steps down

At the meeting of the advanced program directors' council, held September 27, it was announced that Ulf Wikesjö, DDS, PhD, will be stepping down as director of the advanced education program in periodontics. Dr. Wikesjö has been program director for about five years, during which time he has provided significant organization and direction for the program.

Dr. Wikesjö has been involved for a number of years in the area of bone regeneration in periodontal defects, and his leadership in research in this area has made Loma Linda University a recognized leader in this field. He and his group have presented numerous papers at national and international meetings, and are considered to be on the leading edge of research in this area.

Dr. Wikesjö currently plans to continue his full time teaching role in the advanced education area. The department wishes to recognize him for his leadership over the past several years and to express appreciation to him for the quality of his scholarship within the department during that time.

A search committee will be selected within the next few weeks to begin the search for a new program director.


