

Implant dentistry

Nick Caplanis, DDS, assistant professor, lectured at the annual meeting of the European Academy of Osseointegration in Paris, France, on February 8. His topic was *Peri-implant Bone Regeneration*.

Monica Bijlani, DDS, senior resident, lectured for the Osseointegration Study Club of Southern California on January 5 at the Four Seasons Hotel in Newport Beach. Her lecture was on Surgical reconstruction of the Interdental Papilla a clinical case study.

She will lecture on March 2 for the Academy of Osseointegration at the Marriott Marquis Hotel in New York City. She will also present a paper on the Immediate loading of dental implants: influence of early functional contacts on implant stability, bone level integrity and soft tissue quality—a retrospective three year analysis at the Oral Research Scientific Session annual meeting. Her paper was one of 11 chosen from a record number of 97 admitted this year.
