The Current Report

Dr. Byrd retires; banquet honors service to School

Bernard C. Byrd, DDS, retired recently after more than 30 years on the faculty at Loma Linda University School of Dentistry. He was honored at a banquet held June 9, 1996 at the Redlands Country Club, attended by 170 friends, colleagues and alumni. The Byrd's two children and two of their five grandchildren were present for the occasion.

Dean Emeritus Judson Klooster, DDS, presented Dr. Byrd with a plaque recognizing his years of service. Dr. Frederick Bunch, an

OMS graduate in 1976, presented Dr. Byrd and his wife with a cruise to Tahiti.

Dr. Byrd came to the School in 1959 from private practice in Decatur, Georgia. After two years of teaching with Dr. Niels Jorgenson, a pioneer in anesthesia, he pursued postgraduate studies in oral and maxillofacial surgery (OMS).

After graduating with his master of science degree in 1964, he returned to the School and soon became chairman of OMS. He held this title until he stepped down in 1995.

Dr. Byrd and colleague Dr. Elmer Kelln started a residency program, which produced its first graduate in 1968. Since then, 30 residents have graduated from the program.

A vital part of Loma Linda University School of Dentistry for decades, Dr. Byrd has been active on various committees, proved a favorite with the students, and shown excellence in teaching and exhibited a sense of humor.

Friends and colleagues of Dr. Byrd are joining together to raise funds to name the oral surgery clinic in his honor. This project, with a goal of \$75,000, will be the first "named" clinic in the School of Dentistry. Individuals wishing to contribute to this campaign may send their tax-deductible gift to the SD Development Office. Checks should be made payable to Loma Linda University, with a notation for "Byrd clinic."

Dr. Logan moves to Fresno

A farewell lunch and tribute was held for G. Irving Logan, DDS, on June 4 in the Fellowship Hall of the University Church. Dr. Logan has been director of the advanced education program in prosthodontics since 1992. Many members of the faculty and staff of the School of Dentistry attended the event, which also included members of the Logan family.

Dr. Logan was honored for his service, which began in 1979, when he was named assistant professor for removable prosthodontics. He became chair of the department in 1984. In 1987, that department and restorative dentistry combined, and he continued as chair.


Clinic 120 Campaign
