



School to host 37th Annual Alumni Convention

Table clinic presentations, cutting-edge mini-clinics and continuing education lectures promise to make this year's Alumni-Student Convention an excellent event. This 37th Annual Alumni-Student Convention, to be held February 6-10, 1997, also features nearly 100 commercial exhibitors during the first two days.

Table clinics will be presented by 14 teams of dental hygiene students and 18 teams of dental students. Free continuing education is being offered to attendees.

Also included in this year's convention are a student dedication service, two complimentary prayer breakfasts, the Homecoming Banquet, a golf tournament and class reunions.

Members of the dental class of 2000, the dental hygiene class of 1998, and the International Dentist Program classes of 1997 will participate in the student dedication service held Friday evening. The class of 2000 will provide the special music and three faculty members will address the joys and responsibilities of Christian dental health professionals.

"Letting the Power of Scripture Go from Your Head to Your Heart" is the topic Pastor Clarence Schilt, from the Calimesa Seventhday Adventist Church, will present for the prayer breakfasts on February 6 and 7 in Gentry Gym from 7:00 a.m. to 8:15 a.m. The School of Dentistry family is invited to attend these breakfasts on Thursday and Friday mornings. Pre-registration is required for the golf tournament on February 6 at the Moreno Valley Ranch Golf Club.

The Homecoming Banquet that evening honors the classes of 1957, 1962, 1967, 1972, 1977, 1982, and 1987. It will be held at the University of Redlands Orton Center. Class presidents are planning reunions for February 8.

The Homecoming Luncheon for dental hygienists and assistants will be held at the Mission Inn in Riverside on Friday.

Tracks for mini-clinics on February 6 include oral surgery, endodontics, implants (surgical and prosthetic), periodontics, dental trauma and Tjan research topics. February 7 offers mini-clinics in anesthesia, pediatric dentistry, oral pathology and personal finance. The financial seminar carries no credit. Also offered on February 7 are an all-day course in facial esthetics, orthodontics and orthognathic surgery and a four-credit course titled Recognition of Oral Disease for Today's Dental Hygienists and Assistants.

"Prospering through Professionalism" is offered all day on February 9.

The convention wraps up with the Eighteenth Annual Anesthesia Symposium on February 9-10.

Dental School Family Mourns Loss

Nathan Jack Hansen, DDS, MS, longtime School of Dentistry faculty member, passed away on December 29, 1996, from complications of lung disease. He was 76 years old.

Dr. Hansen, a prosthodontist and an artist, began volunteer service in the department of removable prosthodontics in 1976 while he was an Air Force dentist assigned to March Air Force Base. Upon his retirement from the Air Force in 1980, he received a regular faculty appointment which he maintained until shortly before his death.

A native of Idaho, Dr. Hansen went to high school, college and dental school in San Francisco. At the College of Physicians and Surgeons School of Dentistry (now University of the Pacific) he was a classmate of LLUSD Dean Emeritus Judson Klooster, graduating in 1947. Following six years of private practice he began a 27-year career with the U. S. Air Force which included assignments in Guam, Florida, Labrador, Illinois, Alaska and California. In 1959 he completed specialty training in prosthodontics at Tufts University and subsequently served as chief of prosthodontics at several Air Force bases.

Dr. Hansen was a talented artist, medical illustrator and photographer. He provided scores of pen-and-ink drawings for various prosthodontics department laboratory manuals and note sheets. Even after he was confined to his home with his final illness, he continued to complete illustrations for a new partial denture manual. He was also respected as an expert clinician and as an effective, empathetic teacher.

He is survived by his wife of 48 years, Estelle, and by two sons: Ralph, a physician in Beverly Hills and Gary, an engineer and environmental planner in New York. Services for Dr. Hansen were held in Riverside on December 31, 1996. He was buried with full military honors at Riverside National Cemetery.




