Students awarded grants from Dental Foundation

On Wednesday, February 27, D4 dental students Christopher Blount, Byron Diehl, and Darryl Tkachyk each received recognition and were awarded a scholarship from the Dental Foundation of California during a dinner in Los Angeles.

They were chosen from the class of 2002 based on their student leadership, student government activities, community service activities, academic and clinical performance.

The Dental Foundation of California was formed in the late 1960s by five Los Angeles-based component dental societies of the California and American Dental Associations: Harbor, Los Angeles, San Fernando Valley, San Gabriel Valley and Western Los Angeles.

In the mid-1960s the dental societies had a "post payment" program which allowed patients to pay for services on a time payment plan. In order to provide for that program, dentists had a two percent withhold from their fees.

When the program was eliminated, remaining monies were used to fund the Dental Foundation of California. The Foundation was created to provide scholarships to students and to promote their involvement in organized dentistry.

Philanthropic support for School renovations

Patients and visitors to the School of Dentistry have watched as a number of renovation projects have been completed over recent months. While some of these were in anticipation of the recent accreditation site visit, others had been on the drawing board for some time. Almost all of the remodeling costs, purchase of new furniture, etc., has been funded by generous donors, including one dental class who chose the lobby as their honor year project. Other donors have provided "unrestricted" gifts to be used where administration felt the need was greatest. This has enabled the School to achieve a number of important and welcome enhancements without significant impact on the operating budget.

The remodeling of the Prince Hall front entrance and main patient waiting area are the most visible changes, including the enlargement of service windows to provide a more friendly atmosphere for patients checking in and taking care of financial matters. The new carpeting for this area was actually purchased some time ago in coordination with the carpeting for the

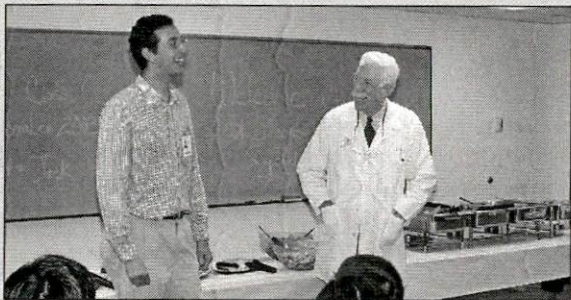

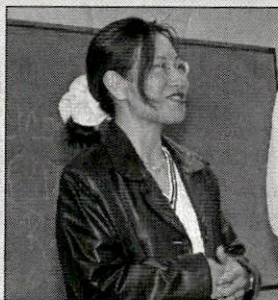

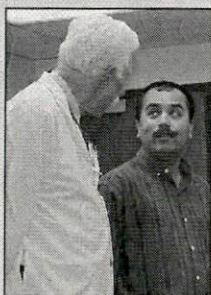
Dr. Bruce Pence, SD'65, (right) introduces Hussam Gharrafi during the recent IDP welcome luncheon.



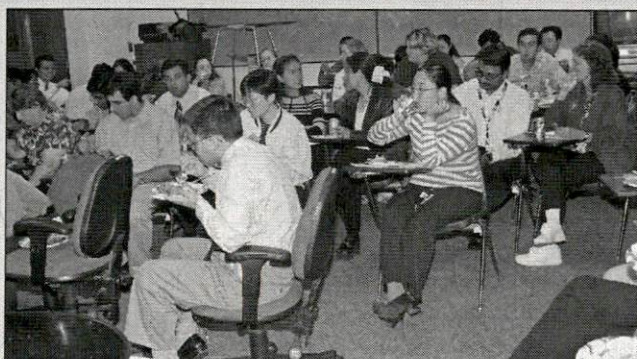

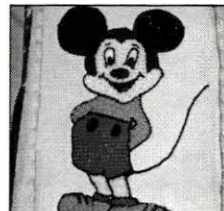

Health Insurance Portability & Accountability Act How does HIPAA affect me?

HIPAA is not just a Dental Computing Department issue—it is an operational issue that will reach out and touch every area of the School of Dentistry. All policies and procedures will need to be reviewed and revised to ensure the safeguarding of patients' health information. New policies will need to be created. All employees (current and new) will need to be educated as to the new HIPAA requirements and then required to review the policies again every three years or as changes are made.

The HIPAA proposal would create new civil and criminal penalties for improperly disclosing patient information.

Intentionally releasing information would be punishable by a fine of up to \$50,000 and one year in jail.

Someone trying to sell information could face a \$250,000 fine and 10 years in prison. The organization would face a maximum annual civil fine of \$25,000 per violation for each requirement.

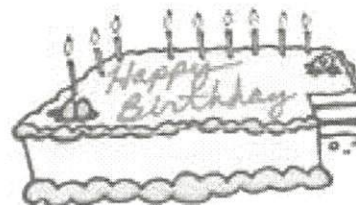

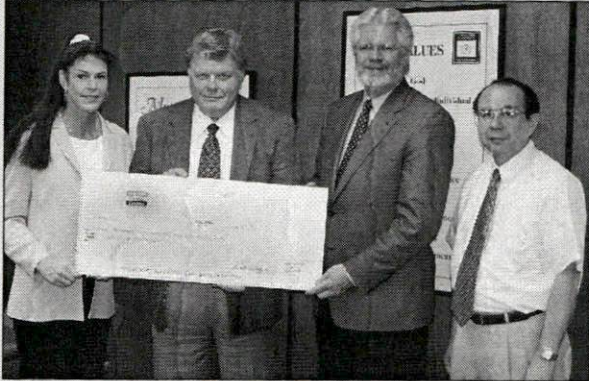

Service learning—spring break activities *by Florence Wetmore*

Spring Break found nine faculty along with 29 dental and dental hygiene students volunteering their time and skills on four mission trips outside the United States.

Quito, Ecuador: Two faculty members—Ron Fritz (SACHS Norton Clinic) and Gerardo Toledo (Restorative), led a team of eight students to Quito, Ecuador. Jessica Buenjemia, Allen Job, Kenneth Lam, Maggie Lam, Kirk Larson, Heather Lauer, Andrea Lewis, Marlon Peter, and Linda Valleni cared for dental needs at an orphanage and an elementary school.

Christianville, Haiti: Drs. Ron Forde, director, service learning and Dan Duroseau, Restorative, joined dental students under the direction of the Christianville Foundation, a ministry established in Haiti in 1978. It is located 18 miles from Port au Prince on 40 acres of farmland where a school was built, followed very soon by a medical clinic, a

dental clinic, and an eye clinic. A modern, clean guest house accommodates volunteers who use their talents to bring humanitarian assistance and Christian education to those who have not been able to receive these services. Student participants this year were Christina Do, Edmund Guo, Rakiya Jones, Youngjoo Kim, Ji Sang Kim, Jacob Lee, and Michael and Andrea Stafford.

Loreto, Mexico: Dr. Mario Flores, Perio, and Letty Lenoir, RDH, dental hygiene, along with dental and dental hygiene students, joined Dr. and Mrs. Larry Day, oral surgery, and Ron Payne, a physical therapist, to work in a small dental clinic established by Dr. Day approximately seven years ago. This clinic has provided much-needed dental care over the years, and we hope to make this a regular service learning mission site. The students included: Dyanna Denny, Sandra Garcia, Julie Gray, and Betty Jimenez from

the dental hygiene program, and Hea Kwon, Chad Ordelheide, Gary Pundt, and Hai Trang from among the dental students.

Francia Sirpi, Nicaragua: Dr. Gadia Peabody, oral surgery, and Dr Robert Apuy, father of Heidi Apuy, led five dental students on a SIMS-sponsored mission trip to a mobile dental clinic serving six villages near Puerto Cabezas. The Adventist medical director for Nicaragua, Dr. Mariano Caseres, a pediatrician, joined the dental team this year. The instructors will take you through an eight-week educational experience that will incorporate standards of excellence in education applied to the health professional higher education setting for distance/online education.

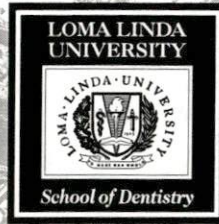
