Forty-sixth Alumni Student Convention held February 9 to 13, 2006

The 46th annual Alumni Student Convention was held February 9 to 13, 2006. Among the many events planned for returning alumni, honor classes, and the School family were student table clinics, continuing education courses for dentists and dental hygienists, and the family day and student dedication.

Scientific sessions on Thursday included implant dentistry, operative/ restorative dentistry, oral and maxillofacial surgery, prosthodontics, digital radiography, and dental hygiene.

On Friday scientific sessions continued, featuring topics in endodontics, pediatrics, operative/restorative dentistry, periodontics, prosthodontics, and dental hygiene, among others. The 26th Annual Dental Anesthesia Symposium, a two-day event, was well attended.

Friday morning, alumni who have served in dental clinics around the globe gathered in the University Church fellowship hall for the annual Prayer Breakfast.

Golf enthusiasts, including faculty, students, and alumni, gathered at Yucaipa Valley Golf Club for a continental breakfast, and then competed in the annual golf tournament. During the dental hygienists and assistants Homecoming Luncheon at Redlands Country Club, Patricia Emmerson, DH'61, was named Dental Hygiene Alumna of the Year (see story below); and Desteen Stroh, class of 2006, was named dental hygiene Student of the Year.

On Friday evening the University Church of Seventh-day Adventists was filled with family and friends of students participating in the Student Dedication service.

During the service Michael Boyko, SD'75A presented the Boyko Award for Christ-like Service in Dentistry to Brian Novy, fourthyear dental student.

Each first-year student was presented a Bible with his or her name embossed on the cover, and students in their final year of study received a lab coat with his or her name embroidered on it.

Every day, she made the 50-mile journey to the School of Dentistry, traveling on a two-lane mountain pass road. She excelled in school and was voted president of her graduating class.

After completing her degree, Mrs. Emmerson practiced dental hygiene in her husband's dental office. She also enjoyed teaching dental health education, serving schools in her community. She has made significant contributions of her time, resources, and expertise to further the mission of the School of Dentistry and the department of dental hygiene. Committed to dental mission service, she traveled to China with the "People to People" delegation, a group of dentists and dental hygienists, where they performed dental mission work.

The dental hygiene Alumna of the Year Award was presented to her during the dental hygienists and assistants luncheon, on Friday, February 10, at the Redlands Country Club.

A leader, she serves as community service representative for her class. She is an exemplary role model for young people.


The plaque awarded to her reads: "LLU Dental Hygiene Alumni Association presents the Student of the Year Award to Desteen Stroh, who represents





In memoriam—Trini Briano July 9, 1919 to February 11, 2006

On Wednesday, March 26, members of the School of Dentistry faculty, staff, and students, gathered to honor and remember Trini Briano, building supervisor, housekeeping service. Mr. Briano had served the dental school for 18 years.

Mr. Briano was born July 9, 1919, in Tulare, California. He was working picking grapes in central California when he was inducted into the service, serving in World War II as a medic. During his service he was awarded many medals, including the Purple Heart. His life was spared on two occasions. Once while taking care of a wounded soldier he looked up to see a Japanese soldier pointing a gun at him. Mr. Briano did not bear arms, and closed his eyes to pray. When he opened his eyes the soldier was gone. On another occasion he and a friend were on leave and ventured into a part of the city where he later learned American soldiers had been killed. An American officer approached them, informing them it was not safe. After walking beside them and guiding them to a safer spot they turned to thank him, and he was gone.

Mr. Briano married the love of his life, Maria Ruth Rincon, on October 27, 1938. He worked for Loma Linda Food Company until it closed and then began working for the School of Dentistry until he retired 18 years later, at age 85. On May 26, 2002, he was given the School Distinguished Service Award during School of Dentistry commencement ceremonies.

He was a member of the Campus Hill Seventh-day Adventist Church, and gave Bible studies throughout the Inland Empire.

He loved his work and fellow staff, and one of his fondest memories was traveling to Argentina with dental students, translating for them. His wife, Maria, had recently passed away and the service learning trip provided him with meaning and hope. "The students," remembers his daughter, Elizabeth Briano-Stevens, "had divided themselves into groups

to assist him, during the trip but they found it challenging to keep up with him." Upon his return, he shared photos and stories from the trip with everyone he knew.

He is survived by his sister and brother: Margaret Ordenez and Manueal Briano; daughters Elizabeth Briano-Stevens and Kathleen Taves; grandsons: Jonathan Briano, Marc Carbajal, and Matthew Taves; granddaughters: Gia Carbajal-Garcia and Keren Castro; and great-grandchildren: Samantha Carbajal-Renteria, Lucas Taves, Carlos Garcia, and Ayranna Carbajal; and many nieces and nephews.
